14.1.1 Application to Amend the Official Plan and Secondary Plans, IMPLEMENTATION OF BILL 51 – Planning and Conservation Land Statute Law Amendment Act 2006: Proposed Official Plan Amendments regarding Requirements for Pre-Consultation, a Complete Application, and Site Plan Control Policies; Proposed Pre-Consultation By-law; Proposed Delegation By-law

Report No. PB-2009-0049

Mrs. Velvet Ross, Manager of Planning, advised that staff is recommending five Official Plan Amendments that bring into force various changes to the Planning Act which were implemented through Bill 51 which came into effect in January of 2007. The Planning Department brought a report to Council for its consideration in late 2007 respecting resulting changes, along with a further report in December of 2007 regarding the retention of professional planning consultant services of

14. PUBLIC MEETINGS cont'd:

Mccauley Shiomi Howson to assist the Planning Division in carrying out the Bill 51 implementation strategy. Since that time, staff continued to conduct research through various municipalities and have now prepared recommendations to Council.

Mrs. Ross advised that through the public meeting process, the Town has fulfilled the requirements of the Act. The advertisement of the public notice as required produced one public comment from Dr. Vandervelden, President of the North East Sutton Ratepayers Association. One piece of correspondence was received by staff this morning from Mr. Mahoney of Michael Smith Planning Consultants, inquiring among other things, where the Town obtained the power to charge a fee for pre-consultation meetings. Mrs. Ross indicated that the authority comes from the Municipal Act which allows municipalities to impose fees or charges for services or activities provided by the Town. The potential of a fee was left blank on the draft forms as staff is currently reviewing the Town's fee by-law.

Mrs. Ross stated that changes to the Act allow the Town to require, over and above what the Municipal Act dictates as mandatory, that an applicant provide any additional information and material that the municipality determines is necessary to deem an application complete. The list included in the five amendments may seem excessive, but it is the Town's intension to try and cover as many types of reports and studies as possible, that may be required, but would not be limited to these. The wording allows Town staff to ask for reports or studies that may not be included on the list and depending on the nature of the application, some items on the list may not be required.

Mrs. Ross explained that the proposed Official Plan Amendments would also add new Site Plan Control policies, providing for a greater degree of control by the Town in exterior building design details which are now done on an ad hoc basis. The Town would be able to address sustainable design elements within an adjoining municipal right-of-way, and to design facilities to have regard for accessibility for persons with disabilities.

Mrs. Ross explained that there is currently a difference of opinion between the Town Solicitor and what has been identified in other municipalities concerning sustainable design elements; it must be decided how far to go with regard to construction standards; green roofs, solar roofs and other features with a bearing on the actual design or structure of a building.

Mrs. Ross advised that staff has requested Council to pass a pre-consultation by-law and a delegation by-law. The pre-consultation by-law would make pre-consultation mandatory in order to carry on with procedure, while the delegation by-law would allow Council to delegate certain powers of authority to certain staff members.

14. PUBLIC MEETINGS cont'd:

Mrs. Ross indicated that the most recent change to the list of possible additional information/materials which may be required with a complete application is the wording from York Region respecting the addition of seven extra items into the list of possible types of studies; Natural Heritage Evaluation, Earth Science Heritage Evaluation, Lake Simcoe Protection Plan Conformity, Greenbelt Plan Conformity, Regional Impact Analysis, Transportation Study and Detailed Service Plan which have already been incorporated into the draft amendments.

No members of the public having an interest in this matter were in attendance.

Mrs. Ross indicated that the proposed amendments to the Keswick, Sutton and Pefferlaw Secondary Plans are identical with respect to the content and structure of the amendments, with the only differences being the location or placement of the specific sections within each Plan. With respect to the Keswick Business Park Secondary Plan, the proposed amendment is not as extensive in terms of the list of possible studies, in consideration of the extensive history of evaluation, especially in regard to the environmental analysis of the lands through the Ontario Municipal Board process and dealings with the Province. Staff felt that it was appropriate not to include an exhaustive list in the Business Park Secondary Plan, while recognizing that the Town has the ability to request other items through the pre-consultation meeting process.

Mrs. Ross noted that all municipalities have a pre-consultation by-law, but only a few have a delegation by-law in place.
