Mr. Sibbald expressed his appreciation to the Town, Fire Department, Police, the Mayor, Councillor Hackenbrook, Town staff, neighbours and community members for their assistance and support after the destruction of the Red Barn Theatre due to fire.

Mr. Sibbald stated that the Barn was saved from demolition in 1973. The Sibbalds have met with Town staff to discuss the possibility of rebuilding the Barn. Consideration was given to applying for infrastructure funding, but the deadline was too soon in order to prepare a complete application. The Sibbalds would like to see the Barn rebuilt, but they would like to see it done correctly, with the right vision, the right building and a good business plan in order to create a successful business venture in the future.

Theresa McNicoll, Catholic School Trustee, stated that the School Board is here to present the Town with the first-ever York Catholic Separate School Board Environmental Award to honour Georgina for its leadership and partnership in the area of greening initiatives and environmental best practices.

Rebecca Watson and James Grey, students at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Elementary School, were in attendance.

James Grey stated that he is a member of the Environmental Club which recycles paper, cardboard, cartons and glass, helping to cut down on garbage.

Rebecca Watson stated that she is also involved with the Environmental Club at her school. The club helps the environment and the community benefits through being able to enjoy healthy trees and more parks in the area. The Club ensures there is less garbage generated, which in turn helps the wild animals.

Ms. McNicoll presented Mayor Grossi a plaque at this time to honour Georgina for its leadership and partnership in the areas of greening initiatives.

12.2 Susan Dobson, Public Education/Outreach Worker, Women's Support Network of York Region, concerning a fundraising walk in Georgina.

Ms. Dobson made a power point presentation to Council at this time, indicating that the theme for this year's walk is 'Back to Basics'. She thanked the Town for permitting the use of its municipal facilities for the closing ceremony and community breakfast at the Peace Garden at the Civic Centre and for staff's and the Mayor's attendance at the closing ceremonies.

Ms. Dobson explained that the walk is to bring region-wide attention to the ongoing issue and prevalence of sexual violence, to raise awareness and increase visibility of all agencies doing work to support survivors and end violence in the community and to mobilize the community. She stated that it is an ambitious 60 km walk, over two nights, from the south end to the north end of York Region.

The walk will be held on May 29th and 30th, beginning in Markham on May 29th at Woodbine Avenue and Steeles Avenue, north to Woodbine Avenue and Mount Albert Sideroad, and then on May 30th north along Woodbine Avenue to the Georgina Civic Centre. The walk will close May 31st in the morning at the Peace Garden.

Ms. Dobson requested that the Town proclaim the month of May as 'Sexual Assault Prevention Month', advertise the event, invite participation of community members to walk as a team, attend the community breakfast on May 31st, and make a donation.
