By-law number 4 for the year 1887.

A By-law to relieve the Treasurer of the sum of \$57.50 and \$25.00 paid by him illegally in the year 1879.

Whereas a culvert was built on River Street in the Village of Sutton in the year 1879 without the authority of the Municipal Council; and the same was paid for by the Treasurer through written orders of the Reem J.B. Stevenson of that year; in favor of Joseph O'Neil \$57.50 and Thomas Stewart \$25.00.

And whereas the Municipal Act. Rev. Stat. of Ont. - Chap. 174 Sec. 247. "Every Treasurer shall pay out in such manner as the laws of the province and the lawful By-laws or resolutions of the Municipal Corporation"

And whereas the said sums have not been passed either by by-law or resolution by the Municipal Council of 1879 or any other Council since that year thereby the said sums were illegally paid by the Treasurer Geo. Evans Jr Esq and he is personally responsible for the sums paid \$57.50 and \$25.00

Be it therefore enacted by the Corporation of the Township of Georgetown; that the Treasurer Geo. Evans Jr. Esq. be relieved of all liability for said sums \$57.50 and \$25.00 paid by him on August 25th 1879.

By-law number 5 for the year 1887.

A By-law to stop the illegal expenditure of the Municipal funds and protect the Public travel.

Whereas several disputes have accrued in the past year through the illegal and wrongful expenditure of the public funds of the Corporation.

Be it Therefore enacted by the Corporation of the Township of Georgia.

1st - That all grants voted by the Council and not let by public competition: before the Reeve grant his order for payment of the same - the following particulars must be placed in his hands. to whom paid - number of days work performed and by whom and all particulars demanded by him and not to be paid until he is satisfied that the grant has been expended as intended by the Municipal Council.

2nd - That no ratepayer or any other person will be paid for repairing building or any other work performed on the public highway without a by-law or resolution of the Municipal Council or written authority of the Reeve and two Council men. - The duties under the Municipal Act of Pathmasters not to come under this clause.

3rd - That when it is necessary to repair the public highway and beyond the resources of the Statute labour the Pathmaster of that

4th. That the Reeve only grant his orders for accounts
 passed by the Municipal Council by lawful
 by-laws and resolutions of the Council.
 and that all by laws and resolutions
 inconsistent with this by-law are hereby
 repealed.

By-law number 10 for the year 1887.

At By-law to close and sell a part of
The Town-line between the Municipalities of the
Townships of Georgina and North Guillemburg.

Whereas The Act of the Legislature of Ontario
46 Victoria - Chap. 18 - Sec. 566 - Sub. Sec. 2 - of the
Consolidated Municipal Act 1883 empowers Municipal
Corporations to sell and close an original Road
allowance and The Municipal Corporations of the
Townships of Georgina and North Guillemburg have
mutually agreed to sell and close a part of
the Town-line between said Municipalities.

And whereas the Consolidated Municipal Act
46 Victoria - Chap. 18 - Sec. 546 - Sub. Sec. 1-2-3 & 4. having
been complied with.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council
of the Corporation of Georgina

That a portion of the Town line between the
Municipalities of Georgina and North Guillemburg
be closed and sold in accordance with the Act
that is to say that portion of the Town line

Commencing where a cut stone monument
has been planted at the South West angle of
lot number one in the seventh concession of
Georgina then north sixteen degrees west along
the west limit of the said lot two chains and
fifty five links to high water mark on the Mill
Race, then South westerly along the Pond on chain
to the west limit of said original allowance
then south sixteen degrees east two chains
more or less - then North seventy four degrees east
one chain to the place of beginning.

Also all that part of the said original
