First Meeting 1913

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Fourth Meeting 1913

Pursuant to adjournment and notice Council met at Baldwin on Wednesday May 28. at 10. A. M.

Members all present; minutes of previous meeting read and adopted, after subscribing to the necessary oath Council proceeded to deal with the appeals against the Assessment Roll for 1913, also the various changes & alterations asked for.
