that purpose

The clerk reported that he had made  
a slight error in the Collector's Roll and  
that four parties had been charged for  
dogs that were struck off the Assess-  
ment Roll by the Court of Revision, and  
that it would be necessary to refund  
said parties their dog tax,

The clerk also reported that he had met  
representatives from Brock and Scott
