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Fourth Meeting 1920

Pursuant to adjournment and adjournment Council met at Pefferlaw on Wednesday May 26 at 10-30 Am

Members all present, Minutes of meeting of April 10th read and adopted.

After subscribing to the necessary oath Council resolved into a Court of Revision and proceeded to revise the Assessment Roll for the year 1920

The Clerk reported that he had received three appeals viz from M. S. Chapman, Philip Shier and Charles Brittenden.

Several parties made application to have dogs struck off the Roll said dogs having died or being destroyed since being assessed

The appeals were taken up and Messrs Chapman and Shier addressed the Court advocating that they were assessed too high in comparison with others in their neighborhood

Moved by Mr Aird Seconded by Mr Orr that the appeals of M. S. Chapman, Philip Shier and Charles Brittenden be dismissed.
