First Meeting 1924

Pursuant to Statute council met at Pefferlaw on Monday January 14. at 11.0'clock a.m. when the following members subscribed to the necessary declaration of office and took their seats at the Council Board, namely Wilmot Riddell, Reece; George Burgess R. H. Corner, Wm. Hadden and Charles Pringle Councillors.

The Reeve reported that those residents in the Municipality along the Hodge Road Jacksons Point requested Council to enter into an agreement with the Hydro Electric Power Commission so that they could obtain Electric Light

Moved by Mr Comer seconded by Mr Pringle that the Reeve and Clerk be and are hereby authorized to sign a By-law empowering them to enter into a contract with the Hydro Electric Power Commission to supply Electrical energy to that portion of the Township along what is known as the Hodge Road Jacksons Point from the Sutton Townline to the Mossington Bridge

By-law No 222 authorizing and approving of an agreement between the Hydro Electric Power Commission and this Township was again read and finally passed.

Moved by Mr Burgess seconded by Mr Hadden that the Statute labor on the Hedge Road from the Sutton Line to the River be commuted at the rate of \$1<sup>50</sup> per day, and that the Reeve oversee all expenditure on said Road, and that the Clerk prepare a By-law empowering same to be passed at the May Meeting
