

Minutes of the Municipal Council of
the Township of North-Guillimburg for
the year 1857.

First Meeting.

Monday January 19th 1857

The council met at Hiram Moore's at 11 o'clock A. M. when the different councillors was called and answered to their names as follows viz. David T. Willson, John Morton, Edward Sheppard, David Sprague and Lawson Barber.

The council all took the necessary oaths and then proceeded to appoint a Reeve.
