First Meeting

Monday Jan^y 1/1850

The Council met at Hiram Moores at Eleven
o'clock A. M. when the different Councillors
were called and answered to their names
as follows viz David Sprague Jun^r, Stephen
Mann, William Moe Young, William M.
Ferry, and John Morton, 5

The Council all took the necessary oaths
and then proceeded to appoint a Meere,

that Mr^r Sprague be the Meere for this Township
for the present year Carried

Moved in Amendment by Mr^r Ferry that Mr^r
Mann be Meere for the present year Lost

Moved by Mr^r Morton seconded by Mr^r Young
that Henry Draper be one of the Auditors for
this Township for the present year Carried

Moved in Amendment by Mr^r Ferry seconded
by Mr^r Mann that Thomas Evans be one
of the Auditors for this Township for the
present year, Lost by the casting vote of
the Meere which he gave to the original Motion

The Meere gave notice that he appointed
Matthew Green as the other Auditor

and that public notice of the said sale be
put up in three public places in this Township;
and that the day of sale shall be within two
