upon the Court examining the list furnished by the County Treasurer of lands liable to be sold for taxes in 1865 it discovered that the arrears of taxes charged against the S.W. 1/4 Lot 19 in 6th Con in 1865 should be charged against the 25 acres on the S.W. corner of Lot No. 20 in 6th Con. it having been entered to the wrong number by the assessor of that year. and also that the N. 1/2 of 8 1/2nd lot No 8 in 7th Con was in error returned as nonresident in 1864 and the Clerk was authorized to notify the County Treasurer of the fact

road divisions. beg to present herewith a draft
of a by Law dividing the roads of this township
into what your Committee consider (after due
inquiry and mature deliberation) to be the
most convenient and equitable divisions
it is possible at present to make into
yours

your Committee would respectfully call your attention to the serious inconvenience as well as loss sustained last year, through overseers of highway allowing and in some instances enticing assessed ratepayers to perform their Statute labour in the wrong Division under overseers who cannot possibly know how many days work to exact from an assessed ratepayer whose name has not been entered on his Road list by the Township Clerk

Your Committee would recommend that all the Statute labour assessed against the west half of Lots Nos 18 + 19 in the 5th Concession be expended in Road Division of No 28 under the superintendence of Thomas Sennett as there is not sufficient labour in Division No 28 to keep the Road in reasonable repair

And that the Statute assessed against the east half of No 23 in the 5th Con be expended on Road Division No 11 under Benjamin Eses

And that John Brown be appointed be appointed overseer of highways for Road Division No 21 newly constructed

And that Henry Nelson be appointed overseer of highways of Road Division No 11 in the place of Thomas W. Keen who has removed and that Thomas Holborn be ordered to expend half of the Statute Labour assessed against him in the said Road Division No 4
