aid for an indigent widow. A bill was presented  
for Election expences, and a bill from the Trustees  
of S. Sec. No 6 of tax on unoccupied land.

 viz. Day labourers, to whom continuous employment can be assured during the whole year. 12 at 60 cents per day during Summer and 40 cents per day during Winter

Day labourers, who can be assured of employment only during the busy season of the year 35 at 65 cents per day during Summer. = Female servants 25 at \$4. per month during Summer and \$3. per month during Winter = Mechanics required. Shoemakers 2 at \$1. per day during Summer and Winter.

Masons 2 at \$1.50 per day during Summer
