Your Committee beg leave to Report as  
follows; That they have seen the Parties Occupying  
the land lying south of the side Road, and  
have ascertained that to purchase the land at  
present occupied by Messrs. Wainier, Sheppard,  
& Sibbold, would cost respectively, \$70 - \$60. & \$40.  
Per Acre, which would not be less, than \$56 Per  
Acre, for the whole length of the Road, amounting  
in the Aggregate to not less than \$300. A sum  
which your Committee could not recommend to  
be paid, from the fact that we certainly have a  
Road there already. And supposing that the  
proper Road should be to the North, or South of  
the Road as now traveled, it would not take  
the same amount of Money, to construct a new  
Road.

Further, your Committee feels it their  
duty to recommend that steps be taken imme-  
diately, to ascertain the most direct and proper  
way, to have the matter finally, and forever  
set at rest.

Report of Road & Bridge Committee  
To the Municipal Council of North Guilford.

1<sup>st</sup> We your Committee beg leave to report as follows, that we, on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of October, proceeded to the Lake Shore for the purpose of staking out the road to be established on the North Part of Lot 27, as intended by the Advertisement, respecting the Closing the Lake Shore Road across the North Part of Lot 27, and establishing the New Road as to be staked out, by the Committee, and found that it would be necessary to run East up to the Centre of said Lot 27, nearly two rods and one half, so that in running North it would intersect the Lake Shore Road South West of the Bridge, near the North Line of said Lot. We your Committee therefore planted a stake on the Centre Line of said Lot 27 rods from the shore, also one on the shore where the New Road will intersect with the Lake Shore Road.

Report of Special Committee Appointed to investigate the Correctness of several Charges of back taxes. Charged upon the Collectors Roll for the Present Year

The Special Committee appointed for the purpose of investigating several charges of back taxes disputed by the persons against whom charged:

Respectfully report as follows: That after careful search of the Assessors Roll and the Collectors Rolls, for the years in which the said taxes accumulated find that there is no arrears of taxes charged against Philip Hingle. And that the amount of taxes charged against the land occupied by S. Corner, should be \$5.<sup>26</sup>/<sub>100</sub>. the balance \$5.<sup>25</sup>/<sub>100</sub> now charged, to be charged against the south east portion of said Lot Number nine in the fifth Concession.

Further we find that there is no arrears of taxes against Lot No. 23 in the 4th Concession, as said Lot does not contain the amount of land for which it has been assessed.

We also find that the arrears of taxes charged against that portion of land occupied by Edward Sheppard for 1864 & 1868 has been paid.

The amount charged <sup>as arrears of taxes</sup> against Park Lots No. 21-22 & 23, Lot 20 Lake Concession is correct, as the Collectors Rolls for the respective year for which charged shows that the taxes were not collected, being returned as no property to distress.
