That owing to an outbreak of small-pox in the Township the first meeting of the Board was held on October 22nd and we took all precautionary measures to stamp out the disease, and by the directions of the Secretary of the Prov. Board of Health, we quarantined all infected houses and exposed persons, we also closed all schools and churches and stopped all thrashing-machines. We had in all Thirteen cases of small-pox in four families and your Board think that we have got the disease pretty well stamped out as they are all out but two families and they will be out in the course of Ten or Fifteen days, we held in all six meetings and herewith annexed is a detailed Statement of Expenses incurred
