The Council Elect for the Township of North Guilford for the Year 1892. met at Belhaven pursuant to Statute on the 18th of January and after taking the necessary declarations of Qualification and office the following members took their seats. viz. James Anderson, Reeve John Boag, Deputy-Reeve, and Elemeel Draper, John Hamilton and John Warriner, Councillors.

Minutes of previous meetings read and approved, the following communications were laid before the Council from Rev. C. R. Bell concerning road at Roach's Point also asking assistance for Mr. Patchell of Jersey.

From Crown Land department re 8th concession

A petition was presented asking that cattle be prohibited from running at large from December the 1st until April the 1st in each year also a petition asking a grant to assist in making a crossing over the Black river on road allowance between Lots 10 & 16 Row 7, also a petition to have the given road across Lots 11, 12, 13 in the 7th Row closed, by the owner purchasing a road-allowance and making it satisfactory to the Council on the south side of Lot 13
