Report of Committee on Lake shore road at Orchard Beach

We your Committee appointed to meet residents along lake shore road
at Orchard Beach; beg leave to report as follows; That we did on
the 15th day of August, visit the locality, and confer with the residents
and while we found the fences in some places had been set
out on the road-allowance, in other places they had been set
in, and that there did not seem to be any disposition on
the part of the owners to encroach on the road, or to assert
any individual right to the portion lying west of the travelled
road. The only part we found fenced on the west side, was
the premises of D^r Young, who expressed himself willing to remove
the whole fence if the council said so; we your Committee advised
that as there was a dangerous place in the road, that would
need railing or filling up; that the fence be allowed to stand
upon this portion and the balance be removed; We also decided
that the only part of said fences that appeared to obstruct the
highway, was that portion in front of the lots of Col Lloyd, M^r Thompson
and M^r Andrews, when these ^{fences} are set back the roadway will be
satisfactory to your committee
