Belhaven February 27th 1911

A special meeting was held at Belhaven on above date, members all present

The meeting was called to try and effect a settlement in a suit now pending, as to the rights of the Municipality in a certain road known as the Arad Smalley Survey, established by Quarter Sessions in 1835.

Mr Marrett moved second by Mr Vanorman whereas Alexander Warder, Hamilton Cassels both of the City of Toronto, and Robert Andrew Duntou and Frederick W. Fairman both of the City of Montreal have applied to the Master of Titles for a Certificate of Title to part of Lot 24 in the ^{sub} concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury fully described in a Public Notice dated 20th December 1910. And whereas the Reeve of the said Township has on behalf of this Municipality caused an objection to be entered to such application, claiming a certain road crossing the said Lot as a Public Highway the same having been surveyed and confirmed by an order made by the Quarter Sessions of the Home District made in the Year 1835, November Session, and whereas an order has been made directing an issue in the High Court of Justice, between the said Corporation and the said applicants; as to the ownership of the said portion of land so claimed as a Highway And whereas the said applicants have made an offer of Five hundred Dollars in cash to the said Corporation for the abandonment of the said alleged highway and the closing up of the same and if necessary a conveyance there of to be made to them. Resolved that the Reeve be and is hereby authorized to instruct the Solicitors for the said Corporation to withdraw objections to the said application and that if necessary a Bylaw of this Municipality be introduced and duly passed to close the said portion of Highway and a conveyance there of duly executed to said applicants in consideration of the

Payment of the said five hundred dollars, which as a security is to be deposited with the Township solicitors and paid out to the Township on completion of the transfer, the applicants are to pay their own costs and also agree to pay one-half of the Township costs, including the preparation and publication of necessary Bylaws and also the conveyance
