The Reeve Explained that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the rebuilding of the Thompson bridge.

Moved by Walter First

Seconded by Walter Thompson

Resolved and it is hereby declared by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of North Gwillimbury that owing to the bridge known as the Thompson bridge (part of which is now swept away) situated on the road running through Lot number thirteen in the seventh concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury being over 200 feet in length and being used by the inhabitants of the Townships of East Gwillimbury and Georgia as well as other Municipalities and the said road or highway being an important road affording means of communication to all the said Townships as well as the Township of Whitechurch and other Municipalities it is unjust that the Township of North Gwillimbury should be liable for the maintenance and repair of the said bridge and it should be maintained and repaired by the Corporation of the County of York and that application should be made to the Judge of the County Court of the County of York for an order declaring the said bridge a County Bridge to be maintained and kept in repair by the said County Corporation.
