Law was passed confirming an agreement with the Bell Telephone Co. regarding the trimming of trees and removal of poles in the Township, also a By. Law authorizing the borrowing of money for the current year,

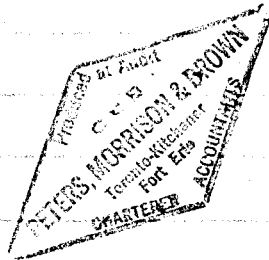

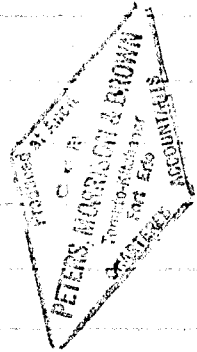

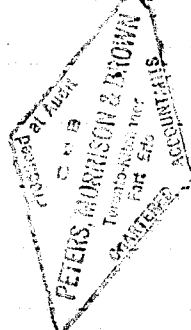

And whereas the said McNamara Construction Co. Ltd are the owners of all the lands on the highway opposite the description hereinafter mentioned except lot 2 and West 1/2 lot 1 plan 914

And whereas the McNamara construction Co. Ltd, have agreed to enter into an agreement with the Township of North Simcoe to protect from erosion the highway from the East limit of lot 7, Con. 9. to the bridge to the Ellis property and to maintain the same forever,

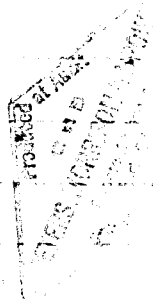

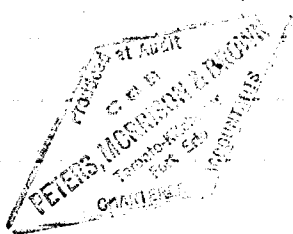

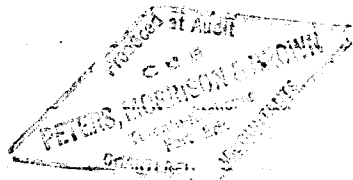
