The inaugural meeting of North Swillimbury Township Council was held at Belhaven on Monday Jan 8th

All the members were present. Rev Mr Ford read a passage of Scripture and prayer was offered by Rev Mr Fockler

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted

A letter was read from the Ontario Municipal Association. It was decided by the Council to drop membership in this Association and instead to subscribe for the Municipal World for the Council and Township Officials

It was moved by Mr Nelson sec by Mr Babb.

That the tender of Peters Morrison and Brown for the Audit of the Township 1939 accounts be accepted and that the Clerk be asked to have them do the work as soon as possible (Carried)

It was moved by Mr Babb sec by Mr Nelson

That Contract with Electrotechnics for maintenance of Keswick Street lights be renewed for one month (Carried)

It was moved by Mr Nelson sec by Mr Smith

That the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to investigate the settlement offered by Armstrong De Witt and Crossin re accident claims of J. A. Nelson & T Hayes. If satisfied to settle same and sign releases or take such other action as they see fit and report to the Council

It was moved by Mr Smith sec by Mr Nelson

That the Clerk be instructed to subscribe to seven copies of the Municipal World one for each member of the Council and two for use of Township officials.

It was moved by Mr Babb sec by Mr Nelson

That Mr Robert Davidson be appointed to attend the adjourned Tax Sale to act on behalf of the Council
