The inaugural meeting of North Swillimbury Township Council elected for 1941 took place at Belhaven on Monday Jan 13<sup>th</sup>.

All the members were present. Prayers were opened by Rev Gordon Rapp who read from the scriptures and offered prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted.

Correspondence read included requests for donations from several institutions. Letters from the Municipal Association

The Good Roads Association and the Municipal World. Mr Hamilton Secy of Pine Beach Association were concerning

several matters and six letters were read concerning Mr Babbs request for an investigation of the police matter.

By Law No 1021 to provide appropriation of \$14000<sup>00</sup> for the 1941 expenditure on township roads was passed and the Clerk requested to submit same to the Department of Highway for approval.

By Law No 1022 to authorize the borrowing as needed of a sum not exceeding \$10,000<sup>00</sup> from the Bank of Nova Scotia. Motion was passed.

By Law No 1023 to authorize the borrowing as needed of a sum not to exceed \$30,000 from the Bank of Commerce was passed.

That the Clerk be instructed to subscribe for the Municipal World for 1941 for each member of the Council also for the Assessor, the Treasurer and the Clerk. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the amount of the subscriptions \$8<sup>00</sup>.

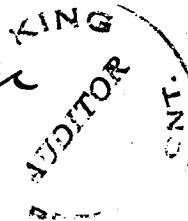

A regular meeting of North Guillemburg Township Council was held at Belhaven on Monday Feb 3<sup>rd</sup>

All the members were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted

Letters were read from different auditors regarding audit of 1940 accounts. It was decided to leave this matter in the hands of Mr Mc Millan and Mr Glover. A complaint regarding charge for oil was received from Mr Redfern of Indianola. The Clerk was requested to answer this and Council ruled that oiling of the T.T.C. right of way through Indianola should be discontinued unless a majority of rate payers of the sub-division petitioned for it. Mr Babbs charge re police were on the table. Four letters were read regarding Mr Babbs request for an investigation of Township police. Mr Babbs was present and addressed the Council briefly. Mr Mc Seare waited in the Council regarding some further expenditure on the park project at Willard Beach. After this was discussed it was decided to leave the matter over to be investigated

Mr Stan Bruels interviewed the Council regarding payment for land in front of Plan 267. A letter was read from his solicitor regarding this

North Guillemebury Township Council met at Belhaven on Monday March 3<sup>rd</sup>. All the members were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted.

Mr Isaac Mariet in a short address illustrated by some slides explained how tree planting could be used to control snow drifting on roads.

Mr William Mariet and Mr George White waited on the Council regard charges for use of the Community Hall for Red Cross purposes. The matter was left to the Hall Board for decision.

Mr Durand and Mr Sheppard discussed with the Council affairs concerning Indianola area. A communication was read from the Department of Welfare advising that following the Dominion Government's withdrawal of their 40% contribution to relief costs the Provincial Government would assume 75% of these costs.
