It was brought to the attention of the Council that in the event of a truck being purchased the proposed over expenditure of \$2800 mentioned at last Council meeting would not be enough to include the purchase of the truck. It was therefore decided that the amount should be raised to \$5000. By Reso No 1044 was passed accordingly for an over expenditure of \$5000 and asking approval of the Department of Highways to cover same.

Minutes of the Council meeting of Dec 15th 1945 were read and by motion adopted

A letter from Dr M. D. Tuckell was read reporting on health conditions in the township and stating that he did not consider the salary paid was sufficient for the amount of work connected with his office

A letter from Mr H. C. Purdy protested the charge made in his 1944 Tax bill for weed cutting in 1943

A letter was received from Mr Fred Bruckon in connection with the account of the Township for advances to the Bach's sisters.

Mr James Clark interviewed the Council regarding the part of the road allowance in dispute between himself and Wm Draper.

Mr Frank Marritt was present and said that some action on the part of the Council might help to bring the seed fair to Belton this year

By Law No 1067 was passed amending By Law No 1063 to increase the salary of the Medical Health Officer from \$1500⁰⁰ to \$2500⁰⁰
