The first meeting of the North Sullumbury Council for the year 1945 was held at Belhaven on Monday Jan 8th. Members present comprising the 1945 Council were Ross A. McMillan, Reeve, Harold H. Glover, Deputy Reeve, Councillors James Nelson, William G. King and L. J. Doyle, all of whom had duly qualified and taken the oath of office.

Rev Mr Stevenson opened the proceedings with prayer and those present observed a moment's silence in tribute to those who had given their lives in the war.

Minutes of the Council meeting of Dec 15th 1945 were read and by motion adopted.

A letter from Dr M. D. Tuckett was read reporting on health conditions in the township and stating that he did not consider the salary paid was sufficient for the amount of work connected with his office.

A letter from Mr H. C. Purdy protested the charge made in his 1944 Tax bill for weed cutting in 1943.

A letter was received from Mr Fred Bruckon in connection with the account of the Township for advances to the Back sisters.

Mr James Clark interviewed the Council regarding the part of the road allowance in dispute between himself and Wm Draper.

Mr Frank Marritt was present and said that some action on the part of the Council might help to bring the seed fair to Sutton this year.

By Law No. 1067 was passed amending By Law No 1063 to increase the salary of the Medical Health Officer from \$150⁰⁰ to \$250⁰⁰.

By-Law No 1068. was passed providing for borrowing as needed from the Canadian Bank of Commerce. Total borrowings not to exceed \$20,000

In regard to Albert Ree's commitment to the House of Refuge Council were advised that he had been accepted but had left the municipality. A letter from the assessors advised that they had refused the claim of Mrs. Verina Pollock for damages to her car on the lake shore road. The Clerk was asked to see the township solicitor and advise him that the Council were willing to give deeds of the old right of way for the third concession at lots 4 and 5 on 3 if the parties concerned were agreeable.

Members of the Council expressed themselves as in favor of the idea and agreed to see what could be done about securing a suitable property.
