

Belhaven January 7<sup>th</sup> 1946

The Council elected for the year 1946 held its first meeting at Belhaven on Monday January 7<sup>th</sup>. Members present comprising The 1946 Council were. Harold H. Glover, Reeve Wm A. Kind, Deputy Reeve. R. J. Doyle, James Nelson and Lloyd Stiles Councillors

Rev Wm Lepp opened the proceedings by reading from the scriptures and offering prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting of the 1945 Council were read and by motion adopted.

Communications from the Good Roads Association and the Ontario Municipal Association were read to the Council

An application for the position of Sanitary Inspector was received from Mr Noble Munro.

A letter was received from the Secretary of Indianola Beach Association making a complaint against the erection and operation of a proposed dance hall on the Purdy property.

The Clerk was requested to reply to this stating the powers the Council had and did not have in the matter. A further letter from the same Association complained about the trouble with surface water from other properties flooding property in Indianola. No action was taken in this.

Mr Carson Pollock interviewed the Council asking for their approval of his operating docks on the shore of the lake opposite Lots 38 and 42 Plan 124

Mr Wallace Downes spoke to the Council regarding his contract for maintenance of Keswick Street Lights. The Council also discussed with him the matter of a street light in front of the Community Hall.

There was considerable discussion regarding the advisability of purchasing a heavy motor grader and snow plow for the Municipality. It was decided that tenders should be advertised for and the District Municipal Engineer consulted.

That the Clerk get in touch with the Hydro regarding having a street light installed in front of the Community Hall at Belhaven getting information regarding cost etc and report to next meeting

That By-Laws be prepared and submitted to next Council meeting to provide for borrowing from the Bank of Commerce and the Bank of Nova Scotia in the amount of \$15,000 from the Bank of Commerce and \$5,000 from the Bank of Nova Scotia.

That the Council have no objection to licenses being granted to Carson Pellet for a dock on the shore of Lake Simcoe opposite lot 38 Registered Plan 124. also a dock on the shore opposite lot 42 Registered Plan 124.

It was moved by Mrs Doyle sec by Mr Stiles

That Mr Noble Munro be appointed sanitary inspector to take the place of Mr Lloyd Stiles

It was moved by Mr Doyle sec by Mr Nelson

That an advertisement be inserted in the Commercial News asking for tenders for road maintainers with snow plow and wing. Tenders received to be reported to next Council meeting.

It was moved by Mr Nelson sec by Mr Stiles

That the Clerk be requested to write to the Red Cross and Women's Institutes in the Township asking them to appoint one of their members to be a representative to act in a committee with the Council in the matter of carrying out what is to be done in recognition of those who served in the armed forces.

After some discussion it was considered advisable to license dance halls in the Township. The Clerk was asked to have the Township solicitor draft a By-Law for this purpose and submit same to a future meeting.

A special meeting of the Council was held at the Clerk's residence on Monday Feb-18<sup>th</sup>. All the members were present.

The meeting was attended by three salesmen from companies who had submitted tenders for motor graders. Mr. J. V. Rudgats District Municipal Engineer from the Department of Highways was also present.

Six tenders for motor graders which had been received for motor graders were opened and examined. Tenders submitted for motor graders complete with snow plow and weighing as follows.

Two of the above tenders included an offer to allow \$300.00 for the grader now owned by the township. In the discussion which followed all members of the Council favored the purchase of one of the above machines. The matter of financing the purchase of such a machine and the By-Law appropriating the amount to be spent on roads was next taken up by the Council and Mr. Rudgats. By-Law No 1084 was passed for an expenditure of \$29,000 on roads for the year 1946.

The matter of three new bridges for which material had been purchased was taken up with Mr. Rudgats.

It was decided that the matter of choosing and closing a deal for the motor grader should be left until a later date.

Kewick March 2/46

A special meeting of the Council was held at the Clerk's office on Saturday Mar 4<sup>th</sup>. All the members were present.

The meeting was held to make a decision regarding purchase of a Galion motor grader with snow plow and wing from the W. R. Ballentine Co Ltd of Toronto. This machine was available for immediate delivery whereas the other companies whose tenders might have been favorably considered were unable to give any satisfaction as to when they could deliver.

After the Council had discussed the matter it was moved by Mr King seconded by Mr Wolfe.

That the Council accept the tender of the W. R. Ballentine Co Ltd to supply one Galion motor grader Model 102 with one heavy duty high lift "V" snow plow hydraulic lift, and one 12' snow wing front mounting, full hydraulic control operated by separate hydraulic pump for the sum of twelve thousand nine hundred and forty five dollars & C. B. Norton & Co. Wellington.

It is understood between the Council and the W. R. Ballentine Co that wheel chains not mentioned in the tender shall be supplied with this machine also wing light and lighting equipment on the machine arranged to the Council's satisfaction. The acceptance of this tender shall not be final until the machine has been brought to the municipality and given a demonstration satisfactory to the Council. A copy of the tender shall be attached to this Resolution.

Monday Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> 1946

A regular meeting of North Wellington Council was held at Belhaven on Monday Feb. 4<sup>th</sup>. All the members were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted.

A letter from Queen Agricultural & Horse Show advised that a public meeting would be held on Friday Feb. 8<sup>th</sup> to decide as to the future of the Queen Fair. Members of the Council were invited to attend.

A deputation of ladies Mrs. Wm. Wirth, Mrs. Mahony and Mrs. Carson Pollock presented a petition from various lodges and societies in the township asking that the matter of installing running water, flush toilets and other improvements in the Community Hall be undertaken. It was decided that this should first be taken up with the Community Hall Board which intended to meet on March 4<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Warren Grossbeck of Brown's Drainage & Metal Products and Mr. Geo. Turnbull of J. D. Adams Ltd. called on the Council. Mr. Charles Hodgins asked that he be given a deed of the right of way formerly the third concession when it passed through his property.

Mrs. Harry Nielsen consulted the Council regarding occupation of his house by Mr. Kelly who was on relief. Mr. Wallace Dornell made a report to the Council regarding a light in front of the Community Hall for street lighting purposes. No action was taken on this.

Council were advised that a hearing by the Municipal Board regarding the By-Law declaring Cassock Beach a residential area would be held at the Community Hall on Thursday Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>.
