

Belhaven, Jan 6/47

The first meeting of The North Guilford Council elected for the year 1947 was held at Belhaven on Monday Jan 6th. The Council. Pres. Harold H. Glover. Deputy Pres. W. G. King. Councillors J. L. Doyle, Floyd Stiles and Clark Martin were all present.

Proceedings were opened by the Rev Mr Rapp who read from the scriptures and offered prayer. Minutes of the December meeting of the 1946 Council were read and by motion approved.

Correspondence placed before the Council includes a letter from Mr. Ruggie re the bridge on the Lake shore Road near J. Paving property. He advised that an inspection of the bridge would be made as soon as possible. A letter from Mr. E. D. Murphy requesting the Council to approve the granting of a water lot in front of his property in Plan 283. A further letter from Mrs. Nicholson re prizes for the oratorical contest. A letter from Muskoka Hospital notifying the Council of admission of Elisha Charles.

Mrs. Geo. Lick and Mr. James Clark made complaints to the Council regarding snow plowing service. Mr. Ruggie spoke to the Council regarding payment for his children attending at Sutton school. He was advised to take this up with the Inspector.

Rev Mr Rapp and Jan Clark spoke to the Council requesting some support for Keewick Hockey Club and Mr. Ennis Burn and Mr. solicited support for the Canadian Regions building project at Sutton.

Mr. P. W. Mahoney notified the Council that he would not be able to act as assessor in 1947.

By Law No - was passed authorizing the borrowing of up to 25,000 from the Canadian Bank of Commerce at Keswick.

There was considerable discussion regarding how snow plowing should be handled also the duties of a Road Superintendent.

It was not considered advisable to put a snow plow on the present township truck but that the maintainer and plow should be operated night and day while the snow clearing was being done.

It was also decided that efforts should be made at Queens Park to have it made possible to allow Mr. Mahoney to continue as assessor.

Mr Percy W. Mahoney was present and the matter of doing the assessing in 1947 was taken up with him. It was decided that he be engaged to do the work at a salary of \$800.00 for the year.

(1) That the salary to be paid the Road Superintendent be fixed at \$125.00 per month. The Superintendent to provide his own car as needed in the course of his duties

(2) That the Road Superintendent will be required to give full time service to the position

(3) That Angus J. King be retained as Road Superintendent on the above terms during the pleasure of the Council

(1) That the salary of the Clerk and Treasurer be fixed at \$2000 per year, ^{for 1947 and} during the pleasure of the Council and that a By-law be passed at next meeting of the Council to confirm this.

By-law No 1105 was passed to convey a part of the road allowance of the original third concession to Rep. Cole

Belhaven March 11th 1947

Council met at Belhaven on Tuesday March 11th. All members were present except Mr Doyle.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted.

A letter from the Department of Highways approved By Law No 1104 re Road Superintendent

A letter from Mrs Violet Mc Naughton called attention to efforts being made by East Gwillimbury and other municipalities to lower the water level of Lake Simcoe. Mrs Mc Naughton thought that the Council should take action to protest this in the interests of summer residents. The Council agreed and the Clerk was asked to draft a resolution accordingly.

In the matter of a building permit for Mr Middletons service station in Plan 186. The Ontario Municipal Board advised that this could be granted subject to the Board's decision after a hearing had been held giving parties within 200 feet of Mr Middletons property a chance to object.

Mr Tullock of Aurora interviewed the Council and quoted a price of \$4800⁰⁰ on a K.R. 10 International Truck. Cab and chassis only.

The renewal of the Treasurers Bond was placed with Mr Percy Winch

A deputation from Keswick appeared before the Council with reference to having a vote taken on Civic Holiday 1947 on a By-law to erect an ice arena at Keswick to cost approximately \$20,000

A further proposal was made that the Council take over a property in Keswick village as a sports field and a site for the proposed arena in the event of a favourable vote. The price named was \$15,000⁰⁰

On account of all Council members not being present these matters were left over until the April meeting of the Council.

By Law No 1106 was passed appointing Mr P.W. Mahoney as Assessor at a salary of \$700 per year

By Law No 1107 amending By Law No 1083 was passed granting an increase of \$400⁰⁰ to the salary of the Clerk & Treasurer

By Law No 1108 was passed enacting that after March 14th 1947 the Township cheques would require the signature of the Treasurer only.

Belhaven Apr 7th 47

North Guillemburg Council met at Belhaven on Monday April 7th. All the members were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted.

A letter from the County of York office outlined the proposed Health Unit for the fourteen northern municipalities. The idea met with the approval of the Council.

A letter from Mrs Annie Willoughby asked permission from the Council to move her gasoline pump to a location in front of her store at Island Grove.

There was some discussion of the proposal to go in with Georgia and the Valley of Anson in leasing ground for a garbage dump from Jack C. Appelle at 35.00 per year.

A deputation from Keswick brought up the matter of submitting a By-law to erect an arena in Keswick to a vote of the electors. Also requested the Council take over a piece of land at Keswick as a sports area and a site for the arena in the event of a favorable vote.

Belhaven Sept 7/47

The Council consented to the vote proposal but turned down the purchase of the land.

Mr Bert Stephens and Mrs Elmer Hamilton interviewed the Council regarding a change in the roadway in the east half of lot 6 on 5. They offered to give a new road allowance in lieu of the present road. It was decided that the matter should be submitted to the engineer of the Department of Highways for his opinion.

Mr Lew Key spoke to the Council regarding some wood that had been cut on the highway. The Road Superintendent was asked to investigate this.

Some representatives of the International people went into the quotation on a heavy truck and snow plow.

It was moved by Mr Martin and by Mr Rules that a By-law to appropriate approximately \$20000 for building a memorial arena at Hurvick be submitted to a vote of the electors of North Guelphincery. That the vote be taken on the fourth day of August 1947.

A letter from Elmhurst Beach Association asked the Council to support their efforts to have the Dominion Government erect a dock opposite their park.

Mr Geo Lamont submitted plans for a new sub-division in Lot 12 Cox 9.

Maude Mrs Taylor from River Edge made a request that Dance Halls be permitted to hold their midnight dances on holiday week ends during the summer season of 1947.

Requests for oil on sub-division roads came from Glenwood Park, Miami Beach and River Edge sub-divisions.

Mr Smith on behalf of the Canadian Legion solicited a grant in aid of their building at Sutton.

Mr Hildebrand representing a Western firm spoke to the Council about a contract for weed spraying.

Tenders for oiling roads were submitted by four different companies. The tender of Jupp Construction Co being the lowest. The matter of making a contract was left over for a later meeting.

The property of Mr. Wm. Able on the east side of the fifth concession was considered the best if it could be bought.

Dr. Tuckler offered to see Mr. Able and if possible get an option on the property also see him about burning and burying garbage.

It was decided that Eastbourn Association and W.A. Hunt should be notified that all garbage from their sub-divisions must go to the municipal dump.

The matter of penalties for dumping garbage in other places and a penalty clause in the garbage contracts was discussed.

The Clerk advised the Council that Mr. Rudger's District Engineer had made a request that alternative tenders for crushed gravel should be advertised for and considered before contracts were made for the 4000 yards of gravel work already advertised for. It was decided this should be done and no tenders dealt with until the Council's regular meeting on June 2nd.

The Clerk was asked to notify all those tendering for garbage contracts of the change in regulations for disposing of same.

Keswick May 22/47

A meeting of the Council was held at the Clerk's office on Thursday evening May 22/47. All the members were present.

The purpose of the meeting was to deal with certain charges made by James and Gordon Sedore concerning Benjamin J. King and Robert Nicholson. The charges regarding Mr King were that the township truck had hauled most of the gravel and sand used in Mr King's house from the township gravel pit. That Mr King had employed township road employees for work at his house and in his bush and that this work had been paid for by township cheques. A further charge stated that the township truck had hauled logs and lumber for Mr King.

Regarding Nicholson the charges were that in addition to using the township truck for Mr King's purposes he had used it some for his own. That he had sold gravel from the township pit and kept the money. That he had put gas purchased by the township in Mr King's car when he had the car borrowed to take Mrs Nicholson to hospital. That he had kept a well of the township snow fence. That he had sold a stove belonging to the township.

Mr King and Mr Nicholson both denied all charges. Mr Oliver Day as a witness stated he had hauled the gravel and sand for Mr King's house and to the heat of his snowmats and lumber had hauled it all. Mr Don Anderson gave similar evidence regarding the hauling of the logs and lumber. Mr King from his personal records fixed the date of the work done at his house by township men and the time sheets when examined showed that the men in question were not working for the township on that date. Mr King could not fix the date of the bush work mentioned but gave evidence as to how the men were paid by himself in both cases.

In regard to a charge that the township truck had made a trip for cement for Mr King. Mr King and Nicholson testified that this cement was for the township culvert near Mr King's house and had been brought at Port Credit. Taken to the township shed and from there to the culvert as needed.

Mr King said he had lived in the township for sixty two years and had never been accused of dishonest transactions before and had never taken anything belonging to the township. He believed he had proved the charges false. That they were caused by spite and asked that the Council clear him.

Mr. Nicholson stated he had never used the township truck for Mr. King's purposes or had not been asked to. He denied the charge of seeing township gravel and Mr. King stated that he checked on this many times and the placing of the gravel on the roads and did not believe it possible that eight loads of gravel put out by two men in one day could disappear without trace. No name, date or other particulars were given in the charge. Regarding the round found Nicholson said the roll of fuel was when Sidors said it was. It was a broken useless roll and he could bring it in any time if it was worth anything. He denied seeing the shovel and Mr. King said he did not know of any shovels missing. He also denied using township gas in Mr. King's car. The reasons for the truck being at his place on May 2 when he was off work were explained. He had permission to take the truck as his car was in the garage for repairs. He said he had often done work on the truck and cleaned it at his own place as he could do it more conveniently than at the township shed. He said he had always taken the best possible care of the truck and had not used it for hauling his own wood or other work.

When all this had been heard the Council's opinion was that the more important of Sidors' charges were definitely proved to be false. The others were not proven and there was apparently apathy at the bottom of the whole affair.

It was moved by Mr. Martin and by Mr. King.

That the Council have taken up the matter of the charges made by Sidors against Mr. Angus King with regard to using the township's gravel, the township truck and paying township employees with township cheques for work on the construction of his own house also having bush work done for himself at the township's expense.

In the opinion of the Council these charges are false and without foundation and they exonerate Mr. King in the matter.

The Clerk is requested to forward a copy of this resolution and the proceedings of this meeting to Mr. Ridgall and the Township solicitor.

The trouble appeared to be due to the fact that the tile drain under Mr Urquhart's property was not working. It was explained that the Council could not carry out work on any one's private property to take care of such conditions and could not share in the cost unless an engineer appointed under the Ditches and Watercourses Act made an award finding they were responsible.

Mr Urquhart did not think he should bear the entire cost of fixing up the tile drain and made application to the Council to have an engineer appointed.

There did not appear to be much that could be done at Boyer Crossing other than cleaning out the ditches at some points.
