

Belhaven. Jan 5th 1948

The North Surlumbury Council elected for 1948 held its first meeting on Monday Jan 5th 1948 at Belhaven. Members present were. Rev. Harold H. Glover. Deputy Rev. William G. King. Councillors J. L. Duff. James Clark and Cecil D Prosser.

Proceedings were opened with scripture reading and prayer by the Rev. Mr Brown of Keswick.

A letter from the township of East Surlumbury stated that their Council was considering paying a bounty for foxes and wanted to know what North Surlumbury was doing about it or if they would take any action on it.

Toronto Stationery Supplies Ltd quoted prices on news and used typewriters.

Mr Harvey Fountain sent a Hydow account for the premises occupied by Mrs Almida Dyer amounting to \$172⁰⁰ gross. This seemed a very heavy charge for three months. He wanted to know if the Council would pay through relief a fair amount for the period. No action was taken on this.

Mr Kerr interviewed the Council regarding purchase of a G. W. D. truck.

Mr Thos Whillier demonstrated a new Imperial typewriter which the Council agreed to purchase.

Mr Floyd Preston asked the Council to consider taking over the snow plow and wing which he was using on township work.

Mr George Lamont spoke to the Council on behalf of the Franklin and Del Beach Associations. They wanted gravel and oil as needed put on their roads and charged as a special tax. He also thought there should be a culvert put across the lake shore road in front of Franklin Beach. Another matter he mentioned was making some better arrangements for voting at election time for rate payers in the area from Willow Beach east to Jacksons Point. The Council promised to give this matter consideration.

There was some discussion and argument over road matters, rates of pay for employees etc.

Mr Wallace Donnell submitted a price for maintenance of Keswick Street lights. As there had been some complaints about this service in the past the Council thought it better to call

The Reeve brought up the idea of having a new building put up at Kenwick part of which would serve as a post office and part as municipal offices. The proposal was that the Council furnish the land and the Dominion Government put up the building. A committee of three of the Council was appointed to follow the matter up.

The Reeve also submitted some figures obtained from Miller Paving Co on estimated costs of widening and making improved roads of the fourth and sixth concessions from the Base line to the lake.

The matter of dogs running at large and making a nuisance of themselves was discussed. The Clerk was asked to see the Township solicitor about drafting a by-law to have this controlled and owners compelled to look after their dogs.

It was moved by Mr Clark sec by Mr Prosser that the Council take up the matter of revising the polling subdivisions in the township to provide better facilities at election time for electors in the area at Willow Beach and east to Jacksons Point.

It was moved by Mr Clark sec by Mr King that the Council agree to purchase a 12" Imperial Typewriter from Mr T. W. Hillier under the terms of agreement submitted to day. Price quoted \$212.50

It was moved by Mr Clark sec by Mr King that a By-law be introduced at next meeting of the Council for regulating the running of dogs at large, providing for impounding the dogs, destroying same or penalizing the owners if necessary. That the Clerk consult the Township solicitor regarding drafting of the By-law required.

It was moved by Mr King sec by Mr Prosser. That the Reeve, Mr Doyle and Mr Clark be appointed a committee to interview Mr J. Smith M.P. regarding the possibility of having the government co-operate in putting up a building part of which would be used for a Post Office at Kenwick and the other part used as a Township office.

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It was moved by Mr Doyle sec by Mr Clark

That the Clerk be instructed to write or contact the Clerk of East Swillimbury regarding By-laws for fox bounties
That an effort be made to have the amount of bounty to be paid and regulations in some uniform over several townships in the district.

That providing satisfactory arrangements can be made a By-law be introduced at next meeting of the Council

On conclusion of the hearing His Honor stated he
would reserve judgement until he had studied the evidence
submitted and would forward his judgement to the
Clerk by mail.

Same was received on Saturday Jan 31st and His
Honor ruled that the appeal was dismissed.

Belhaven Feb 2/48

Council met at Belhaven on Monday Feb 2nd. All members were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion adopted.

Mr Ludwig, District Engineer, Department of Highways was present. Matters concerning roads were discussed with him for some time. He said the Dept would not approve purchase of a bulldozer at the present time. With regard to purchase of a snow plow and wing he seemed doubtful of the advantage, stating that as a rule there was only about 50¢ per hour difference between the hire of a truck with plow and wing and a truck alone. The cost of mounting the plow absorbed a lot of this advantage. He was favorable to the purchase of an up to date tractor mower for weed cutting. He advised calling for gravel tenders early in the season and recommended having gravel put on by tender. He thought it advisable to get rid of the present crushing out pit. The amount for 1948 Road appropriation by law was fixed at \$35,000.

Mr Quilcain, Mr Jeffrey and Mr Martin interviewed the Council soliciting a grant for the North Guillemont Amateur Athletic Association. They assured the Council that this Association was active for the township as a whole.

Mr Frank Marriot brought up the matter of closing an unused side road between the 6th and 7th concessions and disposing of same to owners of the adjoining land.

Mr Joe Irving asked the Council to have an elm tree in front of his property taken down.

Mr Floyd Preston again spoke to the Council about purchasing his snow plow and wing.

Tenders for maintenance of Herwick street lights were opened.

Newick. Feb 20/48

By invitation the Council attended a joint meeting of Sutton, Georgia and North Swillimbury Councils held at Sutton Council chamber. All North Swillimbury Council were present except Mr Prosser.

The first matter discussed was fire protection. Sutton Council wanted to know if Georgia and North Swillimbury were figuring on fire protection of their own. They stated that if they were to continue serving the outside municipalities they would have to spend considerable money on equipment and would have to increase their charges. Various ideas were discussed and it was decided that a further meeting be held to which ex fire chief Reinclair would be invited. In the mean time Sutton Council were asked to have their proposition ready for March 1st Council meeting.

There was a short discussion regarding planning and it was decided an effort should be made to have some expert advice in this respect.

Miss Hollorn brought up the matter of the travelling X Ray clinic which is expected in the district about the end of May. It was thought efforts should be made to have as many as possible attend for examination.

Kenswick Feb 27th 48

North Guelph Council with the exception of Mr. Doyle attended a joint meeting at Sutton with regard to fire protection.

The meeting was addressed by Mr. Sinclair formerly fire chief of the City of Toronto. He did not think Sutton's equipment was very good protection for these municipalities. He had illustrated literature of different types of machines which were on the market. He admitted that the problem was very difficult on account of the lack of water supply in a great deal of the district.

Belhaven Mar 1st 1948

North Wellcombury Council met at Belhaven on Monday March 1st All members were present.

Minutes of previous meetings were read and by motion adopted.

A letter was read from Miami Beach Association expressing approval of 1947 Councils work and offering to cooperate in any possible way with 1948 Council.

A letter from Mr G. V. Ludgate District Engineer stated he was not prepared to approve purchase of snow plow and servicing by the Council.

Mr Taylor of River Edy wrote the Council asking for an extension of hours for operating dance halls.

Mrs Geo Leick interviewed the Council regarding a party opening up a real estate business at Island Grove contrary to the by-law which made it a restricted area. The Council promised to take such action as the solicitor recommended if the by-law was being infringed.

Mr Smith of Franklins Beach urged the Council to amend the by-law for licensing dance halls to permit them to operate for longer hours, claiming they were losing business to other places outside the municipality.

(After some discussion regarding fire protection equipment it was decided to accept the offer of Sutton Council)

Mr Carl Morton reported that Albert and Mrs Marks wished to be moved from Miles Cuypermans house to a house which was available in Queensville. The Council approved.

Mr John Mc Neill presented a petition asking for year round garbage collection from Island Grove to Jackson Point. The Council replied that garbage collection other than the regular summer service should be a private arrangement.

The School Board from School Section No 1 were present. They stated that it was necessary for them to lower the level of the school yard and made a request to have the road opposite the school yard lowered at the same time. The matter was referred to the Road Superintendent to take up with the District Engineer. The Board also complained that their school was not getting its share of the dental service and they thought the Board of Health should do something about the scarlet fever situation.

March 1st meeting

Mr Hossis representing the Children Aid was present and stated that the school attendance of some children at Willow Beach was not satisfactory and he had not been able to get the Truant Officer to get anywhere in the matter. The Council decided that Mr Joseph Sheppard should be replaced as Truant Officer by Arthur King

Letters from the Rec^y Treas^r of ^{Union} School Section Brown Hill were read. They requested a loan from the Council of about \$600⁰⁰. The Clerk was asked to get some further information regarding the School Section affairs and the procedure that should be followed if such a loan were made.

Haverick Belhaven June 5th 1949
