A By-Law

To unite School Sections No<sup>o</sup>s 1 and 4 of this Township

Be it enacted by the Municipality of North-Gwillimbury at its first meeting in January A. D. 1855.  
And it is hereby enacted by the aforesaid authority anything to the contrary notwithstanding, that school sections formerly known as No<sup>o</sup>s one and four of this Municipality be united and form but one school section and said school section shall in future be designated as school section No<sup>o</sup> two of North-Gwillimbury and its boundaries shall be as follows; that is to say commencing between the limits of Lots No<sup>o</sup>s 9 & 10 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Concession then extending said line easterly to the centre of the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession then Northerly through the centre of said 4<sup>th</sup> Concession to the base line then following same course to Lake Shore then Southerly along the Lake shore to the place of beginning.

And it is hereby enacted by the aforesaid authority that this By-Law shall take effect from and after the first day of February 1855.

A By-Law,

To repeal By-Laws No 4 passed February the 4<sup>th</sup> 1854 and  
By-Law No 6 passed February the 21<sup>st</sup> 1852 and also By-Law  
No 6 passed February the 11<sup>th</sup> 1854. And to provide by one  
general By-Law for Licensing, and governing all Shop Keepers  
Store Keepers, and keepers of houses of public Entertainment  
or others selling Wine, Brandy, or other Spirituous Liquors  
ale or beer by Retail within the Township of North Gwillimbury.

- 1<sup>st</sup> Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of North Gwillimbury, and it is hereby enacted, That from and after the passing of this By-Law, the above named By-Laws is and the same are hereby repealed,
- 2<sup>nd</sup> And be it enacted that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to sell or vend any Wine, Brandy, or other Spirituous Liquors Ale or beer by Retail within this Township without first taking out a License from the Treasurer of the Township,
- 3<sup>rd</sup> And be it further enacted, That no Shopkeeper, Storekeeper, or other person or persons except Keepers of Houses of public Entertainment shall not be allowed to sell a less quantity than one quart and not to allow any tippling or drinking inside the shop or store where Women and Children resort to trade,
- 4<sup>th</sup> And be it further enacted, That all Keepers of Houses of public Entertainment shall keep an orderly House at all times and not allow any fitting or other disorderly conduct nor suffer or allow any abusive language to any person or persons entering peaceably or quietly such House and to see such persons leave without let be hindrance,
- 5<sup>th</sup> And be it further enacted, That the following sums are required to be paid for each License, for Shop or Store License the sum of ~~Three~~<sup>Two</sup> pounds. To keep a House of public for licensee to sell Whisky the sum of Two pounds, To keep a House of public Entertainment on the mean leading road where the Male Coach passes the sum of

of Three pounds ten Shillings, in any other locality in the Township the sum of Two pounds Ten Shillings, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and required on the payment of any of the above named sums to issue a license accordingly provided always that no new applicant shall be allowed to take out a license without an order from the Council.

6<sup>th</sup> And be it enacted that any person or persons selling any Wine, Brandy, or other Spirituous Liquors ale or beer without first complying with the requirements of this By-Law shall for such offence forfeit and pay the sum of not less than Two pounds nor more than Four pounds provided always that no such fine shall be collected unless on the oath of the complainant and confirmed by one or more credible witnesses and shall be collected before the Reeve or any Justice of the Peace as all other fines.

7<sup>th</sup> And be it further enacted, That any license issued under the authority of this By-Law shall be dated on the first lawful day in March in each year and be in force until the first day of March in the next subsequent year provided always that the locality shall be described in each license for which it is granted and no one license shall qualify any person to sell in any place within this Municipality except that for which it is granted,

To suppress the immoral conduct of this Council and to prevent further corrupting the morals of an interested public by bad examples.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of North-Gwillimbury and it is hereby enacted, That from and after the passing of this By-Law it shall not be lawful for any member of this Council to speak disrespectfully to any other member of this Council while in Council assembled or use any profane or indecent language to any member or other person attending any meeting of the Council.

And be it enacted, That if any member shall speak abruptly or use any profane or indecent language contrary to this By-Law he shall forfeit and pay the sum of not less than five Shillings nor more than ten Shillings for every such offence to be collected before any Justice of the peace as all other fines, provided always, that no such fine shall be collected unless the offence shall be fairly proved by one or more credible witnesses other than members of the Council.

## Rules and regulations to govern the Council

1<sup>st</sup>

### Meetings and Adjournments of the Council

That this Council do meet at Ten o'clock in the forenoon, unless otherwise specially provided; and if at Ten o'clock there is no quorum the Mace or Chairman may take the Chair and Adjourn with the consent of the majority then present.

2<sup>nd</sup>

That whenever the Mace or Chairman is obliged to adjourn the Council for want of a quorum the hour at which such Adjournment is made, and the names of the members present shall be inserted in the Minutes of the Council.

### Chairman how chosen

3<sup>rd</sup>

In case the Mace shall not be in attendance, the Clerk call the meeting to order until A chairman be chosen who shall preside until the arrival of the Mace.

### Minutes

4<sup>th</sup>

That immediately after the Mace or Chairman shall have taken the Chair the minutes of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk; to the end that any mistake therein may be corrected by the Council.

### When Members may not Vote

5<sup>th</sup>

That every Member who shall be present when a question is put in Council shall vote thereon, unless the Council shall excuse him, and the yeas and nays shall be taken on such question.

### Strangers not to dictate the Council

6<sup>th</sup>

That no stranger shall be dictating the Council without permission from the Mace or Chairman, that any spectators called to order shall sit down so as not to interrupt the Council.

### Order

That when the Mace or Chairman takes his Chair and the members take their seat that no stranger shall walk across the room nor when a member is speaking shall any one hold any discourse to interrupt him nor shall any one pass between any member and the Chairman.

Motion

8<sup>th</sup> That A motion to adjourn shall always be in order

9<sup>th</sup> That no bad language shall be used either from any spectators or any of the Councillors and if so, be liable to a fine of Ten Shillings for the first offence.

To commence on the Township line of East Gwillimby  
on the 4<sup>th</sup> concession line then North along  
said line to the limits between Lots No. 1 & 2  
then East to the centre of the 4<sup>th</sup> concession  
then Northerly to the limits between Lots  
No. 2 & 3 then Easterly to the 5<sup>th</sup> concession  
line then North along said line to the limits  
between Lots No. 9 & 10 then Easterly between  
said lots to the 7<sup>th</sup> concession line to the  
limits between Lots No. 18 & 29 then East to the  
Township line of Georgina then south along  
said line to the Township line of East Gwillimby  
then Westerly along said line to the place of beginning.

And be it enacted, that this By-Law shall  
repeal all By-Laws hereto fore in force.

And be it further enacted, that this By-Law  
shall have full force and effect from and after  
the twenty fourth day of December 1855.
