A By-Law

To appoint one Assessor for this Township  
for the present year.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality  
of the Township of North-Williamburg and  
it is hereby enacted, That there be but one  
Assessor in this Township in the present  
year and that David Sprague junr. be  
the Assessor and that he shall assess the  
Township in Alphabetical order of the  
surnames.

And be it enacted, That the  
Assessor shall foot up each column  
on the Assessment Roll separately and  
distinctively before returning it to the  
Township Clerk, and such Assessment  
Roll shall be delivered by the Assessor  
to the Township Clerk on or before the  
first day of April in the present year

A. By-Law

For regulating and governing Auctioneers and other persons selling or putting up for sale goods, wares, Merchandise or effects by public Auction or outcry.

~~Enacted~~ Therefore be it enacted and it is hereby enacted, By the Municipality of the Township of North-Georgetown that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, to sell goods, wares, Merchandise, or effects, without first obtaining a License from the Treasurer of the Township. And be it enacted, By the authority aforesaid that each person shall pay for every such license the sum of one pound and such license to be and remain in force or virtue only the then present year that the said License is or may be granted for and that no person shall be permitted to take out such License who is not a Resident within this Township, and shall remain a Resident of the same for the term of his License or whenever such person shall remove from the Township he shall forfeit his License, And be it enacted that all persons obtaining such License shall pay to the Treasurer the sum of five shillings over and above the fixed sum by the Council for such license, such Treasurer to be bound to complain to the Township Meire of any person that he may know to be selling without such License under a penalty of one pound. And be it enacted, That this By-Law repeals By-Law No. 39 passed January the 21<sup>st</sup> 1856.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that any person selling without such license shall forfeit to the use of said Township, the sum of not less than three pounds nor more than five pounds on the complaint of one or more respectable witnesses, before the Township Meew or any Justice of the Peace having competent jurisdiction over the same,

A By-Law

To appoint one Collector for this Township for the present year 1857

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North-Guillibury that there be but one collector in this Township in the present year, and that David Willoughby be the collector and that he shall enter into bonds separately and collectively in the sum of Three Hundred pounds, and two sureties of one Hundred and fifty pounds each, before entering on the duties of his office, such bonds to be lodged with the Township Clerk after being approved of by the Council. And be it further enacted, That the above collector shall receive for his services the sum of four pounds, and that the above collector shall return all the per centage that he may be authorised by the Provincial Act to receive, to the Township Treasurer for Township purposes.

And be it further enacted, That any person selling without such license shall forfeit to the use of said Township the sum of not less than three pounds nor more than five pounds on the complaint of one or more respectable witnesses before the Town Meere or one of Her, Majestys Justices of the Peace having competent jurisdiction over the same;

And be it enacted That this By-Law repeals By-Law No 52 passed January 19<sup>th</sup> 1857

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North Guillemburg and it is hereby enacted, That the following sums of Money shall be expended on the several places as herein mentioned, out of the Money now in the hands of the Treasurer and arising out of the Clergy Reserve fund and the sale of public Lands in this Township, that is to say on the Leading road from Sutton to Queensville in this Township the sum of 100 "

And be it further enacted, That all this money herein mentioned shall be laid out by public Contract, the conditions and specifications of all said every part to be made known to the public before said contracts be let, on or before the first day of September next, and the specifications to be made out at our next meeting on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of August next, and advertisements put up accordingly; And it is further enacted That the following persons are respectfully requested to go with a member of this Council to examine the different roads as herein mentioned viz To go with Edward Sheppard, Thomas Glover, and John Barber, to examine the Town line through the 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Concession, the road to Mr. Hammittons between Lots No. 5 & 6; the road from Mr. Scivens to Mr. Chapmans Mill, and the 6<sup>th</sup> Concession south of Lot No. 11. To go with Lawson Barber, Calvin Emes, and E. H. Payson, to examine the Lake shore road, the side road between Lots No. 20 & 21 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Concession, and Paysons Hill. To go with, D. J. Willson, Isaac Merrit, and Peter Shaw, to examine the Base line to Sutton, the side line between 10 & 11 in the Lake Concession, the side line between Lots No. 20 & 21 in the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession. To go with David Sprague, Mr. M. Fry and Smeal Sheppard, to examine the Main road from Sutton to Queensville in this Township, To go with Hugh J. Willson, John York, and William Mache, to examine the 5<sup>th</sup> Concession line south of Lot No. 11, & the Town line between the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Concession And that the Clerk shall give each party notice of their respective duty, that is they are required to examine each road and to report the best plan to mend or make the road as they may think fit and also to serve the Council at this next meeting with a specification of the same. To appoint our Collector for this Township  
for the present year 1857

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality  
of the Township of North-Williamburg that  
there be but one collector in this Township  
in the present year, and that Henry Stearns  
be the collector, and that he shall enter  
into bonds separately and collectively in  
the sum of five Hundred pounds and  
two surities of two Hundred and fifty  
pounds each; before entering on the duties  
of his office; such bond to be lodged with  
the Township Clerk after being approved of  
by the Council. And be it further enacted  
that the above collector shall receive  
for his services the sum of four pounds  
seven shillings and six pence, in accordance  
to his tender of the first of September,  
and that he shall return all the per-  
centage that he may be authorized  
by the Provincial Act to receive; to the  
Township Treasurer for Township purposes.

A By-Law

To assess the inhabitants of this Township for general County purposes, for payment of school teachers; for superintendants wages, for Debentures and interest on Court House, and for general Township purposes.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North-Williamburg and it is hereby enacted, that there be raised levied and collected on the whole rateable property of the residents in this Township in the present year one penny in the pound for the above purposes and that the clerk be authorised to enter the same on the collectors roll in one column.

And be it further enacted, that there shall be raised levied and collected on the Lands of Householders the sum of one farthing in the pound for County purposes and for sixth instalment on Court House, also one farthing in the pound for payment of school teachers and for superintendants wages; and also that there be raised levied and collected on the Lands of Householders the sum of one half penny in the pound for general Township purposes; and that the clerk be authorised to enter the same in three different columns on the collectors roll.
