By-Laws of the Municipality of the Township  
of North-Gwillimburg for the year 1858

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By-Law No. 60

Passed by the Municipal Council of the Township  
of North-Gwillimburg by the authority of the  
Statutes of Canada, to regulate the granting  
of Auctioneers Licenses and governing the  
duties of Auctioneers.

Therefore be it enacted by the authority of  
the Municipality of the Township of North-Gwillimburg,  
and it is hereby enacted, That from and  
after the passing of this By-Law it shall  
not be lawful for any person to exercise  
the calling of an auctioneer in the Township of  
North-Gwillimburg aforesaid or to sell or  
put up for sale by public sale or outcry to  
the highest bidder any goods, wares, mer-  
chandise, property, or effects of any kind  
whatsoever without first taking out a license  
as hereinafter provided.

And be it enacted, That before any person  
shall obtain such license he shall pay to the  
Treasurer of the Township the sum of Eight  
dollars for the general use of the Township  
and on receipt of the afore mentioned sum  
the Treasurer is hereby authorized and required  
to grant to such person a license to sell  
until the third Monday of January next  
after such license is issued.

And be it enacted, That any person selling  
any goods, wares, merchandise, property  
or effects of any description in a public  
manner to the highest bidder or in any  
way practising the calling of an auctioneer  
without first obtaining a license as afore-

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aforementioned; he or shee shall upon the evidence of one credible witness other than the informer be liable to be convicted before the Sheriff or any of Her Majesty's Justices of the peace having jurisdiction, and upon such conviction, shall be liable to a fine of not less than eight dollars, and not more than sixteen dollars and in case the fine and costs shall not be paid within such time as shall be ordered by the justice convicting, it shall be lawfull for the said justice to collect the same by the sale of the goods and chattles of the said offender and in case that there is not property on which to make distress or to make sufficient distress it shall be lawfull to commit the said offender to the common jail of the County in which the said offence was committed, for any term not exceeding one month, unless the said fine and costs shall be sooner paid.

And be it further enacted, That all fines or penalties that may be imposed under this My Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Township where the complaint is brought in behalf of the Township, and in case any person makes complaint on their own behalf they shall be entitled to one half of the fine, and the other half to be paid to the Treasurer of the Township, unless the complainant shall be examined in proof of the offence in which case the whole amount shall be paid to the Treasurer.

And be it further enacted, That My Law No. 55 as passed by the Municipality of the Township of North Guilfimbury regulating and governing the duties of Auctioneers passed the 11<sup>th</sup> day of April 1854 and all other My Laws inconsistent with this enactment is hereby repealed.

A By-Law

Passed by the Municipality of the Township of North-Guillimbury for the appointment of an Assessor for the said Township for the present year 1850.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North-Guillimbury and it is hereby enacted, that there be but one Assessor appointed for this Township for the present year and that John Purdy be the assessor, and that he shall receive the sum of £5. for his services. And be it enacted that the said Assessor shall assess the Township and place the names on the assessment roll in Alphabetical order of the surnames of each person entered thereon

And be it enacted, that before delivering the roll to the Township Clerk, the Assessor shall add or foot up each column on the roll respectively and completely, and shall then deliver it to the Clerk of the Township on or before the first day of April in the present year.

ABY-Law

To divide the Township of North-Guillimburg into School Sections

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North-Guillimburg and the same is hereby enacted, That the several school sections shall be known as follows that is to say.

Union Section Number one with East Guillimburg  
To Commence on the Town Line in front of the first Concession then Easterly to the fourth Concession, then Northerly to the limits between Lots Number one and two, then Easterly to the centre of the said Concession, then North across Lot Number two then Easterly between Lots Number two and three to the fifth Concession, then Northerly along the fifth Concession line to the limits between Lots Number nine and ten then Westerly to the fourth Concession line, then Northerly to the limits between Lots Number ten and eleven then Westerly to the Lake shore, then southerly along the Lake shore to the front of the first Concession, then south to the place of beginning Section Number one,

To Commence between Lots Number ten and eleven at the waters edge, then Easterly to the fourth Concession, then south to the limits between Lots nine and ten then Easterly to the centre of the fourth Concession, then Northerly through the centre of the fourth Concession to the Base line, then Easterly along the Base line, to the limits between Lots Number three and four, then Northerly between said Lots to the Lake shore, then southerly along the Lake shore to the place of beginning.

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Section Number Two

To Commence at the Centre of the fourth Concession on the line between Lots Number nine and ten then Easterly between Lots Number nine and ten to the seventh Concession Line, Then North straight with the said seventh Concession Line to the Centre of the Lake Concession, Then West to Lot Number three, Then South between Lots Number three and four to the Base Line, Then West to the centre of the fourth Concession, Then South through the Centre of the fourth Concession to the place of beginning.

Union Section Number Two with East-Willimburg  
To commence on the Township Line between East and North-Willimburg at the fourth Concession Line, Then Easterly along said town line to the town line of Georgia, Then Northerly along said line to the Limits between Lots Number eighteen and Nineteen, Then Westerly to the seventh Concession Line, Then Southerly to the Limits between Lots Number nine and ten, Then Westerly to the fifth Concession Line, Then Southerly across Lot Number two to the Limits between Lots Number two and three, Then Westerly to the Centre of the fourth Concession, Then Southerly across Lot Number two, Then Westerly to the fourth Concession Line, Then Southerly to the place of beginning.  
Union Section Number one with Georgia.

To Commence on the seventh Concession Line between Lots Number eighteen and Nineteen, Then North along the seventh Concession Line to the Base Line then straight with said Concession to the Centre of the Lake Concession, Then West to the Limits between Lots Number three and four then North to the Lake shore, Then Easterly along the Lake shore to the Township line of Georgia, Then Southerly along said line to the Limits between Lot No. 18 & 19 then Westerly to the place of beginning.



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And be it enacted, That this By-Law shall have full force and effect from and after the twenty fourth day of December 1850

And be it further enacted, That this By-Law repeals all By-Laws and parts of By-Laws heretofore in force defining the boundaries of school sections.

A By-Law

To appoint one Collector for this Township for the present year 1850

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North-Guilford, That there be but one Collector in this Township in the present year, and that David Willoughby be the Collector; and that he shall enter into bonds separately and collectively in the sum of Three Hundred pounds and two sureties of one Hundred and fifty pounds each; before entering on the duties of his office; such bonds to be lodged with the Township Clerk after being approved of by the Reeve. And be it further enacted, That the above Collector shall receive for his services the sum of thirteen dollars in accordance to his tender of the fourth day of September, Inst. and that he shall return all the percentage that he may be authorized by the provincial Act to receive, to the Township Treasurer for Township purposes

By-Law

To regulate the running at large of Turkeys, Geese and other Poultry

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of North-Williamburg and it is hereby enacted that any Turkeys, Geese, or other Poultry found trespassing on the property of any person or persons, the owner of such poultry shall be liable for all damages done by such poultry, to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace, with costs of collection, or the Poultry taken to any poundkeeper in this Township and the Poundkeeper shall take charge of any such poultry and deal with such as By-law No. 65 directs.

A. S. Law

To assess the inhabitants of this Township for general County purposes, for payment of School Teachers, for Superintendants wages, for Debentures and interest on Court House, and for general Township purposes.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North-Swillingbury and it is hereby enacted, That there be raised, levied and collected on the whole rateable property of the Residents in this Township in the present year five eighths of a penny in the pound for the above purposes, And that the Clerk be authorised to enter the same on the Collectors Roll in one Column.

And be it further enacted, That there be raised levied and collected on the Lands of Non-Residents the sum of one eighth of a Cent on the dollar for County purposes and for seventh instalment on Court House, Also one eighth of a cent in the Dollar for payment of school Teachers, and for superintendants wages; And also that there be raised levied and collected on the Lands of Non-Residents the sum of one eighth of a cent on the Dollar for general Township purposes; And that the Clerk be authorised to enter the same in three different Columns on the Collectors Roll.
