## A By-Law.

To appoint one Assessor for this Township for the present year 1860.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality  
of the Township of North-Gwillimbury and it  
is hereby enacted, That there be but one  
Assessor in this Township in the present  
Year, and that Edward Sheppard be the  
Assessor and that he shall Assess the Township  
in alphabetical order of the surnames.  
And be it enacted, That the Assessor shall  
foot up each column on the Assessment Roll  
separately and distinctively before returning  
it to the Township Clerk, and such Assessment  
Roll shall be delivered by the Assessor to the  
Township Clerk on or before the first day of  
April in the present year.

To appoint a collector for this Township for the present year 1860

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality  
of the Township of North Gwillimbury. That there  
be but one Collector in this Township in the  
present year; and that Hugh J. Willson be  
the Collector, and that he shall enter into  
bonds separately and collectively in the sum  
of double the amount on the Collector's Roll  
and two securities in one half the amount  
required of the Township Collector, each before  
entering on the duties of his office such bond  
to be lodged with the Township Treasurer  
after being approved of by the Reeve.

Be it further enacted. That the above collector  
shall return all the percentage that he may  
be authorised by the provincial act to receive  
to the Township Treasurer for Township purposes.

A By-Law

To apportion a certain sum of Money towards purchasing  
a Township Library.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council  
of the Township of North-Gwillimburg and it is  
hereby enacted by the authority of the same  
that the sum of one Hundred Dollars be  
taken from the funds of this Township and  
applied towards the purchase of a Township  
Library and subject to the regulations provided  
according to Law as will be furnished by the  
Chief Superintendent of Education with an  
equivalent sum of Money and to any By-Law  
which may be passed by the Municipality of  
this Township.

Rules and regulations to govern  
the Council.

1<sup>st</sup>. That this Council do meet at ten o'clock in the forenoon unless otherwise specially provided; and if at ten O'clock there is no quorum the Reeve or Chairman may take the chair and adjourn with the consent of the majority of the members then present.

2<sup>nd</sup>. That wherever the Reeve or chairman is obliged to adjourn the council for want of a quorum the hour at which such adjournment is made and the names of the members present shall be inserted in the minutes of the Council.

3<sup>rd</sup>. In case the Reeve shall not be in attendance the Clerk shall call the meeting to order until a Chairman be chosen who shall preside until the arrival of the Reeve or until adjournment of the meeting.

4<sup>th</sup>. That immediately after the Reeve or Chairman shall have taken the Chair the minutes of the preceding <sup>meeting</sup> day shall be read by the Clerk; to the end that any mistake therein can be corrected by the Council.

5<sup>th</sup>. That every member who shall be present when a question is put in council shall vote thereon unless the Council shall excuse him and the yeas and nays shall be taken on such question.

6<sup>th</sup> That immediately after the Reeve or Chairman

6<sup>th</sup> The minutes of the council shall consist of a record of the names of all the members present at any meeting of the Council; and of all the proceedings taken in Council.

7<sup>th</sup> That every member previous to speaking shall rise from his seat and address himself to the Chair. To be added

8<sup>th</sup> That when two or more members shall rise at once the Reeve or chairman shall name the member who is first to speak.

9<sup>th</sup> That when the Reeve or Chairman is putting a question no member shall walk out of or across the Council hall nor when a member is speaking shall any member hold discourse to interrupt him except to order.

10<sup>th</sup> That a motion to adjourn shall always be in order.

11<sup>th</sup> That in Committee, a motion that the Chairman leave the chair shall always be in order and shall take the place of any other motion without debate.

12<sup>th</sup> That no motion except for adjournment, for going into Committee of the whole; or for receiving report of petitions shall be debated or put unless the same is in writing and seconded.

13<sup>th</sup>

That in forming Committee of the whole council the Reeve or Chairman before leaving the Chair, shall appoint a chairman to preside who shall have the same authority in the chair of the Committee as the Reeve in the chair of the Council, except deciding questions of order.

14<sup>th</sup>

On motion in Committee to rise and report the question shall be decided without debate.

15<sup>th</sup>

That when the Reeve or chairman takes his chair and the members take their seats no stranger shall walk across the room nor when any member is speaking shall any one hold any discourse to interrupt him.

16<sup>th</sup>

That no stranger shall be dictating the Council without permission from the Reeve or Chairman, that any spectators called to order shall sit down so as not to interrupt the Council.

17<sup>th</sup>

That no bad language shall be used either from any spectators or any of the councillors and if so they shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings for the first offence.

B, and 15<sup>th</sup>

That it shall be the duty of the Reeve or Chairman to preserve order and decorum. And to see that the above rules are strictly adhered to and complied with, and any Person, or Persons, violating any of the said rules, shall be dealt with and fined, according to <sup>Consolidated No. 1</sup> By Law ~~18~~, and adding Rule 15<sup>th</sup>.

That all Petitions to this Council shall be presented by a ratepayer of this Municipality, who shall be answerable to this Council, that they do not contain any Improper, or Importunate Matter, and that no Petition be received later than twelve of the Clock (noon) at any Session of this Council.

- 1<sup>st</sup>. That the Road commonly called the Barber Road commencing on the front of the fourth Concession and running westerly through the centre of Lot Number Twenty Three in the second and Third Concessions to a certain street of the Town plot of Keswick be established and the same is hereby established.
- 2<sup>nd</sup>. That the survey and report of James McCallum Provincial Land Surveyor of date 11<sup>th</sup> of May 1860 are and shall be the Meets & Bounds of the said Road.

free Commissioners.

No. 97.  
By-Law

To divide the Township of North-Gwillimbury into school sections  
and to repeal the former ones now in force.

Be it enacted by the Township of North-Gwillimbury  
and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the  
same. That from and after the passing of this  
By-Law the school sections shall be as follows.  
That is to say - School section No. 1 to commence  
at the Town Line of East-Gwillimbury at the  
fifth Concession Line. Then North said Line to the  
limits between Lots No. 8 & 9. Then West to the  
Centre of the fourth Concession. Then North the  
Centre of the fourth Concession to the limits between  
Lots No. 13 & 14. Then West between said Lots to the  
Lake shore. Then southerly along the Lake shore  
to the front of the first Concession to the Town  
Line of North and East-Gwillimbury. Then along  
said Town Line to the place of beginning.

School section No. 2

To commence at the centre of the fourth Con-  
cession between Lots No. 13 & 14. Then North through the  
Centre of the fourth Concession to the base line  
then East to the limits between Lots No. 3 & 4.  
Then North to the Lake shore. Then along the  
Lake shore to Lot No. 39. Then southerly along  
the Lake shore to the limits between Lots  
No. 13 & 14. Then easterly to the Centre of the  
fourth Concession or place of beginning.

### School Section No. 3

To commence between Lots No. 30 and 31 in the centre of the fourth concession. Then North to the Base Line. Then East to Lot No. 3 then North between Lots No. 3 & 4 to the lake shore then along the lake shore to the limits between Lots No. 18 & 19 to the base line. Then West on the base line to the centre of the seventh concession. Then south the centre of the seventh concession to the line between Lots 30 & 31. Then West to the centre of the fourth concession or place of beginning.

### School Section No. 4

To commence in the centre of the fourth Concession between Lots No. 30 & 31. Then East to the centre of the seventh Concession. Then south in the centre of the seventh Concession to the line between Lots No. 13 & 14. Then West to the sixth Concession line. Then south to the line between Lots No. 8 & 9 then West to the centre of the fourth Concession or place of beginning.

### School Section No. 5

To commence on the Town Line of East Gwillimbury at the fifth Concession line. Then North along said line to the limits between Lots No. 8 & 9. Then East to the 6<sup>th</sup> Concession line. Then North to the limits between Lots No. 13 & 14 then East along said line to the Town line of Georgina. Then south along said line to the Town line of East Gwillimbury. Then West said line to the place of beginning.

And be it further enacted. That the several persons herein after named shall be appointed to call the first school meeting in their respective sections.

And be it further enacted. That this By-Law shall come into force from and after the Twenty fifth day of December next.

A. J. P. Law

To Assess the inhabitants of this Township for general County purposes, for payment of School Teachers, for Superintendents wages, for Debentures and interest on court house, and for general Township purposes.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North Gwillimbury, and it is hereby enacted, That there be raised levied and collected on the whole ratable property of the residents in this Township in the present year one half cent in the Dollar for the above purposes. And that the Clerk be authorised to enter the same on the Collectors Roll in one Column.

And be it further enacted that there be raised levied and collected on the lands of the residents the sum of one Quarter of a cent on the dollar for County purposes and for the ninth instalment on court House. Also one quarter of a cent on the dollar for payment of school teachers, and for superintendents wages, and also that there be raised levied and collected on the lands of the residents the sum of one Quarter of a cent on the dollar for general Township purposes. And that the Clerk be authorised to enter the same in three different Columns on the Collectors Roll.

## A By-Law

To establish a road through the centre of the sixth concession of the  
Township of North-Guillimbury.

Be it enacted by the Municipality of the  
Township of North-Guillimbury and it is hereby  
enacted by the authority of the same, That from  
and after the passing of this By-Law the road  
recently surveyed by James M. Ballou jun.  
commencing on the town line between East and  
North-Guillimbury in the centre of the sixth Concession  
row and running Northward through Lots No.  
1-2-3-4 & 5 to the side line between Lots No. 5 & 6  
be considered to all intents and purposes a  
Public Highway.
