To appoint one Collector for this Township for the present year 1863

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipality of the Township of North Guilford that there be but one Collector in this Township in the present year. To apportion the Clergy Reserve Money of this Municipality among the several School sections

Whereas for the better satisfaction of the late payers of this Municipality it is necessary and desirable to divide and apportion the money arising from the clergy reserve fund among the several school sections of this Municipality

Therefore Be it enacted by the Municipality of the township of North-Wellington and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same that the money known as the clergy reserve money shall be equally divided among the several school sections as soon as the same is available and that the amount apportioned to each section be handed over to the trustees of each section to be used for the benefit of the schools in such a way and manner as the late payers require

And be it enacted that should the school trustees of any of the school sections see fit to accept their share in promissory notes payable on the first day of January next they may have the same transferred to them now by giving the corporation of this Municipality a receipt for the said notes as cash paid

And be it further enacted that the union school section with Georgina shall have a just and equal proportionable share and that the same shall be applied exclusively for the benefit of the late payers residing in North-Wellington
