By Law No 137

A By Law to appoint one assessor. one collector and one tavern inspector for the township of North Swillimbury for the present year 1864

Whereas it is necessary to appoint one assessor one collector and one tavern inspector for this township for the present year

Therefore Be it enacted and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the Municipality of the North Swillimbury

1st That William Perry shall be and is hereby appointed assessor for this township and shall fulfil the duties of township assessor for this township for the present year in accordance with the provincial Statutes. and it is further enacted that the aforesaid assessor shall add up each column separately in the assessment Roll and arrange the names of the Residents in alphabetical order on the Roll

2nd Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that Thomas Bennett be and is hereby appointed tavern inspector for this township for the present year and he shall perform the duties of said office in accordance with the provincial Statutes and the by laws of this township

3rd Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. that Isaac Marritt be and is hereby appointed collector for this township for the present year and that he shall enter into bonds Separately and collectively in the sum of double the amount on the collectors Roll and two Sureties in one half of the amount required of the township collector each. before entering on

on the duties of his office. Such bonds to be deposited with the township treasurer after being approved of by the Council

4th and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that the aforesaid Collector shall return all percentage (that he may be authorized by the provincial Statute or by any by law of the County Council to receive as such Collector) to the township treasurer for township purposes

5th and be it further enacted that the assessor hereby appointed shall receive the sum of twenty dollars for his services as soon as the Roll is accepted by the Court of Revision

6th and be it further enacted that the Collector hereby appointed shall be paid for his services the sum of twenty dollars to be paid at the end of the year

7th and be it further enacted that the town inspector hereby appointed shall receive the sum of five dollars for his services at the end of the year

By Law No 141

To authorize the sale of that portion of the original road allowed or concession road ~~opposite~~ ^{between} the second and third concessions and opposite lots numbers six, seven and eight in said concessions of the township of North Wellinbury and County of York

Whereas application has been made to this Council by William Burr Jerry James Bailey and Hiram Moore, to convey to them that portion of the concession road in front of the third concession in the township of North Wellinbury and opposite their respective lots numbered six, seven and eight in the said concession on such terms as the Municipal Council of the said township may deem just and equitable and in compensation for the land appropriated as a public road, and now travelled across the said lots in place of such original allowance

And Whereas due notice has been given according to law of the passing of this by law

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the township of North Wellinbury and it is hereby enacted by virtue of the authority given by the Municipal Act of Upper Canada to Municipal Councils to convey lands and road allowances in certain cases, that the Reeve of this Municipality on behalf of the Corporation shall convey by deed in fee simple under the Corporate Seal of this Municipality the whole of the said Concession Road commencing at the side line between lots numbers five and six and extending northerly to where it intersects Cooks Bay a portion of Lake Simcoe, to the above named applicants in the following proportion

proportion and on the payment of one
Dollar each and in consideration of the
New or now travelled Road

That that portion of the said Concession
Road lying opposite lot number six in
the said third Concession be dedded to the
said William Burr Terry Yeoman of North Willimbury
aforesaid his heirs and assigns forever

A By Law to assess the inhabitants of the township of North Guilimbury for general county purposes for the payment of School teachers for Local Superintendants Salary and for general township purposes for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty four

1st

Therefore Be It Enacted by the Municipality of the township of North Guilimbury and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same that there shall be raised levied and collected on the whole taxable property of the residents of this township in the present year the sum of four Mills on the dollar for the above mentioned purposes that is to say one mill and a half on the dollar for county purposes one mill on the dollar for the payment of School teacher and Local Superintendants Salary and one and a half Mill on the dollar for general township purposes and the Clerk is hereby authorized to enter the same on the collectors roll in three different Columns

And Be it further enacted that there shall be raised levied and collected on the lands of non residents within this Municipality the sum of one and a half Mill on the dollar for County purposes and one mill on the dollar for the payment of School teachers and a Superintendants Salary and one and a half Mill on the dollar for general township purposes and the Clerk is hereby authorized to enter the same on the collectors roll in three different Columns

By Law No 143

A By Law to provide for the Licensing of Shops and taverns or houses of public entertainment and other places where beer wine and other spirituous or fermented liquors may be sold by retail within the Municipality of North Wellington and otherwise to regulate the same

Whereas under the provisions of the act 25 Victoria Chapter 6 it is necessary authorized some person to grant certificates wherewith to obtain licenses to sell beer wine and other spirituous and fermented liquors within this Municipality

^{1st} Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the township of North Wellington and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same that the township treasurer is hereby authorized to grant a certificate wherewith to obtain a license to any person applying for it upon the receipt of the sum of twenty dollars and a certificate from the tavern inspector or if there is more than one the certificate must be signed by a majority of such tavern inspectors to the effect that the person or persons so applying have all the necessary accommodations required by law or the by laws of this Municipality such license to be and remain in force from the date thereof until the first day of March next ensuing

2 No tavern inspector shall grant any certificate to any person applying for such until he or they are satisfied that the person making application has the following accommodations that is to say

a good comfortable house containing at least three clean beds and sufficient bedding therefore exclusive of those used by his or her own family. And at least two comfortable bedrooms and one sitting room or parlour exclusive of the bar or tap room and of the rooms usually used by his or her family and also good warm stabling and proceeds for at least eight horses, a good comfortable driving house and shed for the accommodation of travellers also a good substantial yard or enclosure wherein the cattle or stock of any drover or other person may be kept secure at night.

3 No tavern keeper or shopkeeper shall give or sell any beer wine or other spirituous or fermented drinks to any person who is addicted to excessive drinking to the inquiry of his or her family after being duly notified to the contrary by any member of his or her family. Nor shall it be lawful to give or sell any intoxicating drinks to any person while in a state of intoxication nor shall any tavern keeper permit any riotous or disorderly conduct in or about his or her tavern to the annoyance of his or her guests.

It Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that it shall be lawful for the township treasurer to grant a certificate where with to obtain a shop license to any person within this township on the receipt of a certificate from the township clerk that the person so applying has first obtained the consent of the Municipal Council to sell spirituous or fermented drinks beer and wine by retail and the sum of fifteen dollars which shop license shall be and remain in force from the date thereof till the first day of March next ensuing. provided always that it shall not be lawful for any shopkeeper or other person to sell any beer wine or other spirituous or

1 or fermented liquors in any less quantity than one quart which ^{in the} shall not allow the purchaser or any other person to drink or consume in or about his or her shop or other premises.

Any Shopkeeper or other person not having obtained a license in accordance with this by Law and with the Provincial Statutes who shall sell any trifling thing such as Crackers cigars &c. and give the purchaser thereof any beer wine or spirituous liquor shall be deemed guilty of selling without a license and punished accordingly upon conviction thereof.

The Inspector of Licenses or if more than one is appointed may at any time at his or their discretion endorse on the back of any Tavern License permission to the Tavern Keeper holding the same to sell the liquors named in his or her license at any place within this Municipality or to remove from the house originally licensed to any other house having the necessary accommodations and any license so endorsed shall remain in force during the full term for which it was granted and upon the same conditions.

Any Tavernkeeper or Shopkeeper or other person who shall not conform to the provisions of this bylaw or shall ~~not~~ violate any of provisions hereof shall upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace having competent jurisdiction be liable to a fine of not less than two

two

Not more than twenty dollars at the discretion of the Court one half to be paid to the informer and the other half to the township treasurer for township purposes. The fine together with costs to be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender and in case no distress can be made to be imprisoned in the common goal for a term of not less ten days nor more than one month.

8 All informations under this Bylaw shall be laid within one month from the Commission of the offence

9 All Bylaws or parts of Bylaws inconsistent with the provisions of this Bylaw are and the same are hereby repealed
