Whereas by the 29th & 30th Vic. Cap. 51 power is given to Municipal Councils for closing up and sale of original Road allowances when no longer required for public travel and

Whereas William Woods, Lawson Barber and A. G. P. Dodge Esquires have made application to the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimburg to have conveyed to them by deed in fee simple so much of the original Road allowance between the Second and Third Concessions as lies opposite their respective Lots in the Township of North Gwillimburg on such terms as the Municipal Council of the said Township may deem just and equitable and in compensation of the Land apportioned as a public road and now traveled across the said Lots in place of such original allowance, and

A By-Law to assess the Ratepayers of the Township of North Guillemburg for General County purposes, for the payment of School Teachers, for School Superintendents salary and for General Township purposes.

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of N. Guillemburg enacts as follows; that there shall be levied and collected on the whole ratable property of the resident assessed Rate Payers of the Township of North Guillemburg in the present year the sum of Two and a half Mills on the Dollar for the above mentioned purposes. That is to say One and a quarter Mills on the Dollar for County purposes. One half Mill on the Dollar for the payment of School Teachers and Local Superintendents salary and Three quarters of a Mill on the Dollar for General Township purposes

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that there shall be raised levied and collected on the lands of Nonresidents assessed within the Municipality of North Guillemburg for the present year the sum of Two and a half Mills on the Dollar; That is to say One and a quarter Mills on the Dollar for County purposes, one half mill on the Dollar for the payment of School Teachers and Local Superintendents Salary and Three quarters of a Mill on the Dollar for General Township purposes.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that the Clerk of this Municipality is hereby required to enter the same on the Collectors Roll in three different columns.

A By-Law passed by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilfimbury for the stopping up and sale of the original Road Allowance in front of Lot Number Five in the Third Concession of said Township; and also for the purpose of repealing By-Law No Two Hundred and Seven passed by said Council.

Whereas by the Statute 29th and 30th Vic. Chapter 51 Sec. 333 authority is given to Municipal Councils to pass By-Laws for the stopping up and sale of Original Road Allowances when no longer required for Public Travel

Commencing at the South West Angle of Lot Number Five, and the Eastern line of the Then Northerly along the Western Line of the said Lot Number Five and the Eastern line of the said Original Road Allowance Twenty chains more or less to the Side Road between Lots Number Five and six. Then Westerly along the Side Road One chain more or less to the rear of the Second Concession.
