By Law, No. 247

Whereas Power is given to Municipal Corporation (by an Act passed the 34th Vic. Chapter 31.) to Pass By-Laws, for the Purpose of Aiding and Encouraging the Planting of Trees along the Roads and Highways in their respective Municipalities. The Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Guillinbury enacts as follows.

1st That any Person owning or Occupying Property Adjoining any of the Roads or Highways in this Municipality, Planting, or Causing to be Planted along their fences joining said Road or Highway any Maple, Ash, Oak and Hickory trees at a distance of not less than fifty feet apart, or ever-green at a distance of not less than one hundred feet apart shall be entitled to the sum of ten Cents for each tree so Planted by giving sufficient evidence that such trees have been Planted not less than twenty four Months, and that they are thrifty and likely to live and said trees not to be less than one and a Quarter inches in diameter, two feet from the Ground.

one dollar per day, For every span of Horses and
Plow or Waggon, the sum of one dollar, For
every yoke of Oxen, the sum of seventy five cents
Every Commissioner, to receive at the rate of one
dollar per day, for all the time he may be necessarily
employed,

By Law No. 251

A By Law to Establish a Road through the Centre of the seventh Concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury, Commencing at the Line between Lots No^s 13 and 12. Then southerly, to the side Line between Lots No^s 10 & 11.

Whereas by the Provisions of the Statutes of Upper Canada, 29 & 30 Vic. Cap. 51 Power is given to Township Municipal Councils, to establish Public highways.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury and it is hereby enacted by the Authority of the same, that from and after the Passing of this By Law the Line of Road as recently surveyed by James Mr. Callum, R. L. S. (The report whereof ~~is~~ bears Date the first day of June A.D. 1872) through the Centre of the seventh Concession of the aforesaid Township of North Gwillimbury, Commencing at the Line between Lots Numbers thirteen and twelve Thence southerly, Parallel with the seventh Concession Line, to the side Line between Lots Numbers, Ten and eleven in the said seventh Concession, be, and it is hereby established as a Public highway, to all intents and Purposes,

The said Road to be not less than sixty feet in width, and the whole width to be taken off, from, each side of the Centre of the said Lot

By Law No. 252

A By Law, to Divide the Township of North Gwillimbury into Polling sub-divisions and to Repeal By Law No. 209.

Whereas by Provisions of the Statutes of Ontario, 32. Vic. Cap. 21 Municipal Councils are Authorized and Required to divide Municipalities into Polling sub-divisions, whenever the Number of Qualified Voters therein shall exceed two hundred

Therefore be it enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury, and it is hereby enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this By Law, the said Township of North Gwillimbury be, and it is hereby Divided into three Polling sub-divisions, as follows;

Sub-Division Number one, to be composed of the Western Part of said Township, and bounded as follows, That is to say: Commencing at the south West Angle of the said Township, Then Easterly along the south Line of said Township, to the fourth Concession Line, Then Northerly along the fourth Concession Line to the Lake Shore, Then Westerly and southerly along the Lake Shore, to Beaches Point, Then southerly following the Lake Shore to the Western Limits of the said Township, Then southerly along the said Western Limits to the Place of beginning

Sub-Division Number Two, to be composed of the fourth and fifth Concessions, and a portion of the Lake Concession, as follows. That is to say: Commencing on the southern limits of said Township where it intersects the fourth Concession Line, Then easterly along the said southern limits, to the sixth Concession Line, Then northerly along the said sixth Concession Line to the Lake Concession (or Bass Line) Then westerly along the Bass Line to the side Road between Lots Number ten and eleven in the Lake Concession, Then northerly along the ^{side} Road to the Lake shore Then westerly, following the Lake shore, to the fourth Concession Line, Then southerly, along the said fourth Concession Line, to the southern limits of said Township, (and Place of beginning)

Sub-Division Number Three, to be composed of the Eastern part of said Township, and bounded as follows: That is to say: Commencing on the south line of said Township where it intersects the sixth Concession Line Then easterly along the said southern limits, to the south east angle of said Township, Then northerly along the eastern limits of the Township as aforesaid to the shore of Lake Simcoe (or northern boundary) Then westerly along the Lake shore, to the side Road between Lots Number ten and eleven in the Lake Concession, Then southerly along the said side Road to the Bass Line, Then easterly along the Bass Line to the sixth Concession Line, Then southerly along the sixth Concession Line to the Place of beginning

Number two hundred and nine, Passed the
eleventh day of September A.D. 18~~87~~⁸⁹ be, and
it is hereby Repealed, — Save and Except, so far
as relates to the holding of any Elections where
the Voters List for 1871, is required or may

By Law No. 253

A By Law for the Purpose of Opening the side Road between Lots Nos 15 & 16 in the 2nd & 3rd Concessions of North Gwillimbury, and causing the removal of fences and other obstructions in said ~~side~~ Road, Allowance

Whereas Certain Portions of the side Road between Lots Numbers 15 & 16 in the 2nd & 3rd Concessions of the Township of North Gwillimbury, are now enclosed by fences, and occupied by Private Parties

and
Whereas it is necessary that said side road should be opened in its proper place as a Public highway

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury ^{therefore} enacts as follows:

1st That the side Road between Lots Number fifteen and sixteen in the second and third Concessions in the said Township of North Gwillimbury be, and it is hereby Ordered to be Opened, in Accordance with the survey of H. B. Wadsworth, P. L. S.

A By Law to Assess for County Purposes
for General Township Purposes, for the Payment
of School Teachers, Inspectors, Examiners, and
for High School Purposes,

Be it enacted by the Council of the
Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg
that there be levied and collected on the
Whole rateable Property of the Resident &
Assessed Ratepayers of the said Township, for
the Present Year, the sum of two and three quarters
Mills on the dollar for the above mentioned Purposes
That is to say: one Mill on the dollar for County
Purposes, one Mill on the dollar for General
Township Purposes, and three quarters of a Mill
on the dollar for the Payment of School Teachers,
Inspectors, Examiners, and for High School Purposes

And be it further enacted by the Authority
aforesaid, that there be levied and collected on
the lands of the Non Residents Assessed within
the Municipality aforesaid, for the Present Year
the sum of two and three quarters Mills on the
dollar, ^{That is to say} one Mill on the dollar
for County Purposes, one Mill on the dollar for
General Township Purposes, and three quarters
of a Mill on the dollar, for the Payment of
School Teachers, Inspectors, Examiners, and
for High School Purposes

By Law No. 256

A By Law to establish a road on the North half of Lot No 27 in the 3rd Concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury, and for the closing up and sale of the Lake Shore Road in front of that portion of said Lot.

Whereas by the 29th & 30th Vic. Cap 51, power is given to Municipal Councils to establish Public Roads, and also to close up and dispose of Original Allowances for Roads when no longer required for Public travel — and

Whereas the Lake Shore Road bordering on the North half of Lot No. 27 in the 3rd Concession of the aforesaid Township has (from the washing away and caving in of the banks) become unsafe for travel, and it has become necessary to establish a road to be used in lieu ~~thereof~~ of the road thus rendered unsafe — and

Whereas due Notice has been given (as required by Law) of the passing of this By Law.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows; that a Public road be, and it is hereby established on the North half of Lot Number twenty seven in the third Concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury. Said Road to be fifty feet wide, and the Centre of the road to commence on the Lake Shore, twenty five feet north from the Centre of the said Lot, Then Easterly (Parallel with the dividing line through the Centre of said Lot,) ninety two and one half rods, Then North to a Post Planted where the New Road will intersect with the now traveled road

And be it further enacted that the Reeve of this Municipality on behalf of the Corporation shall Convey in fee simple under the Corporate seal of this Municipality to Daniel Willoughby of the Township of North Gwillimbury in the County of York, Yeoman, his heirs and assigns forever (as Payment in Part,) for the Aforesaid Road laid out and established by this By Law on said Lot Number twenty seven) All the Original Allowance along the Lake Shore, bordering on the North half of Lot Number twenty seven, in the Third Concession of the Aforesaid Township of North Gwillimbury, opposite the Road established by this By Law as aforesaid

A By Law to authorize and empower the Reeve of the Township of North Gwillimbury, to dispose of, sell, and convey, certain Original Allowances for Road in the Town Plot of Keswick,

Whereas by the 29th & 30th Vic. Cap. 51 Sec. 345, Sub. Sec. 2, Power is given to Municipal Councils to Pass By Laws for Closing up and sale of Original Allowances for Roads in certain Cases, — and

Whereas certain Road Allowances in the Town Plot of Keswick, are no longer required for Public travel, — and

Whereas due Notice has been given of the Passing of this By Law,

Therefore be it enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury, and it is hereby enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the Reeve of the Township of North Gwillimbury aforesaid be, and he is hereby authorized, and empowered, for and in behalf of this Municipality, and, under the Corporal seal of the same, to dispose of, sell, and convey by Deed in fee simple, the following Road Allowances in the Town Plot of Keswick, Namely, The streets running North and South, as follows; That is to say: Gibb's Street from the traveled Road, South, to where it intersects Massington Street; The whole of Kennedy Street, from Bowsher Street South.
