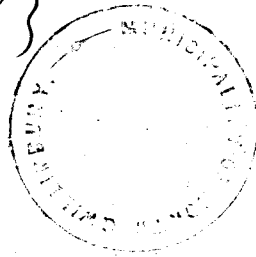
A Bylaw to appoint Township Auditors

A Bylaw to Assess for County purposes, for General Township purposes, On account of Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (County Bylaw) also Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (Township Bylaw) and for the several school sections as required by trustees of said Sections

Whereas the (Rev. Sta. Act) gives power to Municipal Councils to levy and collect rates, for all purposes except school rates and whereas the amended School Act makes it the duty of Township Councils to collect rates when application is made as aforesaid

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Simcoe, and it is hereby enacted by the Authority of the said:

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the Assessment for the year 1884 the sum of Five thousand and thirty three dollars eighty four & three quarters cents being a Rate of $5\frac{1}{2}$ Mills on the \$ That is to say

For County purposes, the sum of nine hundred and fifteen dollars Twenty Four & $\frac{1}{2}$ cents being a rate of 1 mill on the \$

For General Township purposes the sum of nine hundred and fifteen dollars Twenty Four & $\frac{1}{2}$ cents being a rate of 1 mill on the \$

For payment of School Teachers the sum of Two hundred and Twenty Eight dollars & Eighty one cents being a rate of $\frac{1}{4}$ mill on the \$

For Industrial Home the sum of Two hundred and Twenty Eight dollars & Eighty one cents being a rate of $\frac{1}{4}$ mill on the \$

For Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (County Bylaw) the sum of nine hundred & fifteen dollars Twenty Four & $\frac{1}{2}$ cents being a rate of 1 mill on the \$

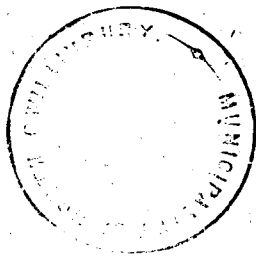

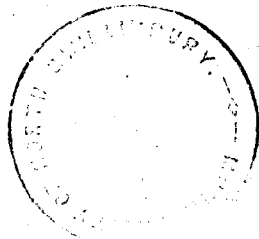
