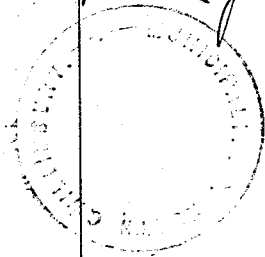

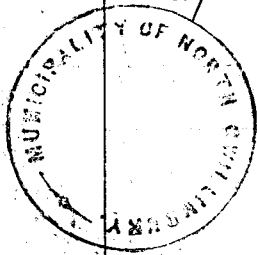

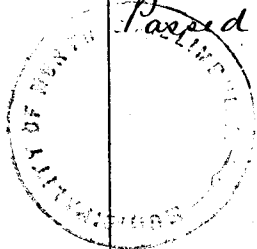
A Bylaw to reduce the Statute-labor of the Township of North Gwillimbury for the Year 1888

Bylaw No 419

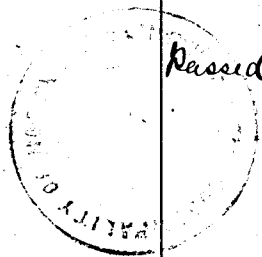
A Bylaw to empower the Reeve and Treasurer of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow a certain sum of money to meet current expenses

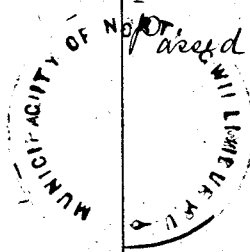

Bylaw No 421

A Bylaw to assess for County purposes, for General Township purposes; On account of the Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (Clev Bylaw) also Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (Ys Bylaw) and for the several school sections as required by the Trustees of said sections.

Whereas the (Rev Sta Out) gives power to municipal councils to Levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg enacts as follows

That there be levied and collected from all the Rateable property on the Assessment Roll for the Year 1888 the sum of  $5373\frac{12}{100}$  Five thousand five hundred and twenty three Dollars and nineteen cents being a rate of  $6\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$.

That is to say; For County purposes the sum of  $1114\frac{64}{100}$  Eleven hundred and fourteen Dollars and sixty-four cents being a rate of  $1\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$; For General Township purposes the sum of Thirteen hundred and thirty seven Dollars and fifty-six cents, being a rate of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mills on the \$; For payment of School Teachers the sum of Two hundred and twenty two Dollars and ninety-three cents being a rate of  $\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$; For Industrial Home the sum of Two hundred and twenty two Dollars and ninety-three cents, being a rate of  $\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$; For Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (Co Bylaw) the sum of Eight hundred and ninety one Dollars and seventy-one cents being a rate of 1 mill on the \$; For Lake Simcoe Junction Railway (Op Bylaw) the sum of seventeen hundred and eighty-three Dollars and forty-two cents, being a rate of 2 mills on the \$.

And for the several School sections to be levied on the property in said sections, as near as may be the following amounts viz

## Bylaw No 422

A Bylaw to appoint & three persons to act in connection with the ex officio officers of the Township of North Guillemburg as a Local Board of Health

Whereas the Public Health Act of Ont makes it the duty of Township Councils to appoint a Local Board of Health in each Municipality

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg enacts as follows

That William Henry, Isaac Marritt and Joe D. Davidson be and are hereby appointed members of the Local Board of Health of the Township of North Guillemburg and that they receive the sum of 2<sup>00</sup> Two dollars each per day for their services for time actually spent as members of said Board

That Dr Bentley be and is hereby appointed Medical Health Officer for the said Township of North Guillemburg and that he receive the sum of 2<sup>00</sup> per day and mileage for attending meetings of said Board

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Willimbury acts as follows

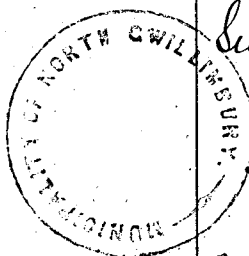

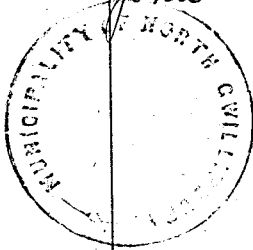


Bylaw No 424
