A Bylaw to appoint certain Township Officers for the Township of North Guillemburg for the Year 1890

Be it enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same

- 1<sup>st</sup> That John B. Sprague and Geo. W. Davidson be and are hereby appointed Auditors to audit the accounts of the Year 1889, and that they receive the sum of 3<sup>00</sup> Dollars each for their services as such Auditors
- 2<sup>nd</sup> That Wayman Prosser be and is hereby appointed Assessor for the Township of North Guillemburg for the Year 1890 and that he receive the sum of Forty Five Dollars for his services as such assessor
- 3<sup>rd</sup> That David Sprague be and is hereby appointed Collector for the Township of North Guillemburg for the Year 1890 and that he receive the sum of Forty Dollars for his services as such collector
- 4<sup>th</sup> And that the following named persons be and are hereby appointed to act with the ex officio Officers as the Local Board of health for the Township of North Guillemburg for the Year 1890 viz: Wm Henry Henry Draper and John Lowenby

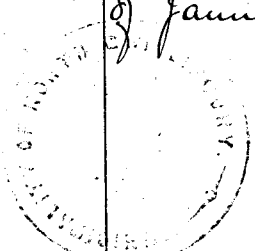

A Bylaw to empower the trustee of school section no 4 of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow on the credit of the said section the sum of \$300<sup>00</sup> three hundred dollars, and to make provision for issuing a debenture for said amount - (if required)

Whereas it has become necessary to raise the sum of three hundred dollars \$300<sup>00</sup> for payment of school site and other expenses,

and

Whereas power is given councils to pass bylaws empowering trustee to borrow on the credit of said sections requiring money.

Therefore the council of the corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows, that the trustee of the above mentioned section are empowered to borrow on the credit of said section the sum of 300<sup>00</sup> three hundred dollars, said amount to be levied and collected on the property in said section in the year 1890 in addition to all other taxes that may be required, and a debenture be issued for said amount.

A Bylaw to fix the place of holding the nomination of Candidates for the Office of Reeve, Deputy-Reeve and Councillors for the Township of North Westlambton for the Year 1891; Also the place for holding the Election in the several polling-divisions, and appointing Deputy Returning Officers.

Whereas in accordance with (42 Vic, cap 18) it becomes the duty of Township Councils to pass Bylaws appointing the place of holding the Nomination and Election in the several Municipalities

 — — — 3, School House No 7.

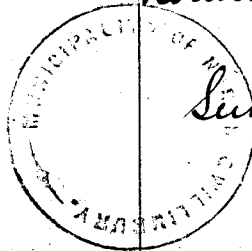

A Bylaw to authorize and empower the Trustees of School Section No 4 of the Township of North Guillemburg to borrow on the credit of said section the sum of sixteen hundred dollars for payment of new school-house &c

Whereas the Trustees of School section No 4 have applied to the Council to raise by Debentures the sum of sixteen hundred dollars for payment of new school-house &c, in accordance with Sec 129 of the Public school Act of Ont

Therefore

Be it enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg that the Trustees of the above-mentioned section be and are hereby empowered to borrow on the credit of said section the sum of sixteen hundred dollars, to be paid in four annual instalments of four hundred dollars each together with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum, the first payment to be made payable December the 14<sup>th</sup> One thousand Eight hundred and ninety-one. Said amounts to be levied and collected on the property in said sections in the years 1891. 1892. 1893 and 1894 in addition to all other taxes that may be required, and that Debentures be issued for the same

A. By-law to assess for county-purposes, for General Township purposes, - On account of the Lake Simcoe Junction Railway By-law and for the several school sections as required by Trustees of said sections.

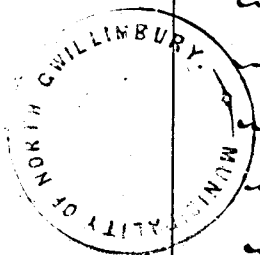
Whereas the (Rev Sta Out) gives power to Municipal Councils to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned:

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Willimbury enacts as follows,

That there be levied and collected from all the Rateable property on the Assessment Roll for 1890, the sum of 5339<sup>25</sup> Five thousand three hundred and thirty ~~two~~ nine dollars and twenty-five cents being a rate of 6 1/4 mills on the \$, that is to say, for General Township purposes, the sum of Ten hundred and sixty-seven dollars and eighty-five cents 1067<sup>85</sup> being a rate of 1 1/4 mills on the \$, for County purposes, the sum of Ten hundred and sixty-seven dollars and eighty-five cents, being a rate of 1 1/4 mills on the \$, for payment of school Teachers, the sum of Two hundred and thirteen dollars and fifty-seven cents, being a rate of 1/4 mill on the \$, for Industrial Home, the sum of Two hundred and thirteen dollars and fifty-seven cents being a rate of 1/4 mill on the \$, for Lake Simcoe Junction Railway Co By-law, the sum of Ten hundred and sixty-seven dollars and eighty-five cents, being a rate of 1 1/4 mills on the \$, for Lake-Simcoe Junction Railway (Op By-law), the sum of Seventeen hundred and eight dollars and fifty-six cents, being a rate of 2 mills on the \$; and for the several school sections to be levied on the property in said sections, as near as may be the following amounts

in certain cases; And whereas petition has been made to  
this Council that the following streets not being required  
for public travel be closed and sold.

as required by (Sec 546 of Chap 184) Rev Sta Act has been given

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township  
of North Wellington enacts as follows: That the following  
named streets in the Town Plot of Keswick be closed and sold

Item 1<sup>st</sup> namely. That portion of street north of Block B opposite Lots  
4.5.6.7.8.9.10.11.12 or otherwise from Lot 3 East to Turner Street

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> also Gibbs Street north of Rain St to Wm Pundys Line

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> - Kennedys - - - - -

Item 4<sup>th</sup> - Rain's - East of Gibbs St to J. B. Spragues Line

Item 5<sup>th</sup> and Road Allowance along the East side of the Town  
Plot of Keswick. And be it further enacted that the  
Reeve of the Township of North Wellington be and is hereby

Item authorized and empowered, for and in behalf of this  
Municipality, and (under the corporate seal of the same) to  
dispose of and sell, and convey by deed in fee simple the
