A Bylaw to assess for County purposes, for general Township purposes; For Lake Simcoe Junction Railway Purposes, And for the usual school sections as required by Trustees of said sections

Whereas - the (Rev Sta Ord) gives power to municipal Councils to levy and collect rates for all purposes above-mentioned therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows.

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the Assessment Roll for 1893, the sum of \$5757<sup>83</sup> five thousand, seven hundred and fifty-seven dollars and eighty three cents, being a rate of  $7\frac{3}{4}$  mills on the \$, that is to say: For General Township purposes, the sum of \$1671<sup>63</sup> sixteen hundred and seventy-one dollars and sixty-three cents, being a rate of  $2\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$, For County purposes, the sum of <sup>1114<sup>42</sup></sup> eleven hundred and fourteen dollars and forty-two cents, being a rate of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mills on the \$, For County School purposes the sum of one hundred and eighty-five dollars and seventy three cents <sup>being a rate of  $1\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$</sup> \$185<sup>73</sup>, For Industrial Home the sum of One hundred and eighty-five dollars and seventy-three cents \$185<sup>73</sup> being a rate of  $\frac{1}{4}$  mills on the \$, For Lake Simcoe Junction Railway the sum of Two thousand six hundred dollars and thirty two cents \$2600<sup>32</sup>, being a rate of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  mills on the \$. And for the usual school sections to be levied on the property in said sections as near as may be the following amounts. viz
