A Bylaw to assess for county purposes, for General Township purposes, and for the several school sections, as required by the Trustees of said section.

Whereas power is given municipal councils to levy and collect rates, for all purposes above-mentioned therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilfimbury enacts as follows.

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the Assessment Roll for 1896, the sum of \$3519⁰⁰, three thousand five hundred and nineteen dollars and fifty-one cents, being a rate of $4\frac{3}{4}$ mills on the \$.

That is to say For General Township purposes, the sum of, one thousand eight hundred and fifty two dollars, and thirty-eight cents, being a rate of $2\frac{1}{2}$ mills on the \$.

For County purposes the sum of one thousand four hundred and eighty-one dollars, and ninety cents being a rate of 2 mills on the \$.

For industrial Home, the sum of one hundred and eighty-five dollars and twenty-four cents, being a rate of $\frac{1}{4}$ mills on the \$.

And for the several school sections, to be levied on the property in said sections, as near as may be the following amounts

Bylaw no 486

a Bylaw to authorize and empower the Trustees of school section no 5, of the Township of North Guillemburg, to borrow on the credit of said section the sum of \$1040⁰⁰/₁₀₀ Ten hundred and forty dollars, for payment of new school House &c.

Whereas the Trustees of school section no 5, of the Township of North Guillemburg, have applied to the Council to raise by debentures, the sum of Ten hundred and forty dollars, for payment of new school-House &c in accordance with Sec 129 of the Public School Act.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg, enacts as follows. That the Trustees of the above mentioned section be and are hereby empowered to borrow on the credit of said section, the sum of Ten hundred and forty dollars \$1040⁰⁰/₁₀₀, to be paid in four annual instalments of Two hundred and sixty dollars each, together with interest thereon at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, the first payment to be made payable December 14th 1897 said amounts to be levied and collected on the property in said section, in the years 1897. 1898. 1899. 1900 in addition to all other taxes that may be required, and that debentures be issued for the same.
