Bylaw no 509

A Bylaw to assess for county purposes, for general Township purposes, and for the several school sections as required by the Trustees of said sections.

Whereas power is given municipal councils to levy and collect rates, for all purposes above-mentioned

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Willimbury enacts as follows:

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the Assessment roll for 1900. the sum of \$3591<sup>41</sup> Three thousand five hundred and ninety one dollars and forty one cents, being a rate of 4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mills on the \$.

That is to say. For General Township purposes, the sum of \$945<sup>12</sup> nine hundred and forty-five dollars and twelve cents, being a rate of 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mills on the \$.

For General school purposes, the sum of \$1134<sup>15</sup> Eleven hundred and thirty-four dollars and fifteen cents being a rate of 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> mills on the \$, For county purposes, the sum of \$1512<sup>20</sup> fifteen hundred and twelve dollars and twenty cents, being a rate of 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mills on the \$.

And for the several school sections to be levied on the property in said sections as near as may be the following amounts:
