Bylaw No 520

A Bylaw to assess for county purposes, for general Township purposes; and for the several school sections as may be required by said sections.

Whereas power is given Municipal Councils to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows,

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for 1902, - the sum of Three thousand six hundred and Twenty-nine dollars and forty-seven cents, being a rate of $4\frac{3}{4}$ mills on the \$.

That is to say for General Township purposes the sum of nine hundred and fifty-five dollars and twelve cents, being a rate of $1\frac{1}{4}$ mills on the \$.

For General school purposes, the sum of Eleven hundred and forty six dollars and fifteen cents, being a rate of $1\frac{1}{2}$ mills on the \$.

For County purposes, the sum of One thousand five hundred and Twenty-eight dollars and twenty cents, being a rate of 2 mills on the \$.

And for the several school sections to be levied on the property in said sections as near as may be the following amounts,
