Bylaw no 530

a Bylaw to encourage the building of wire-fences in the Township of North Gwillimbury.

Whereas the Consolidated Municipal Act empowers Councils to pass Bylaws to assist in making snow-fences.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows. That to encourage the building of wire-fences in this Municipality. Any person putting up a wire-fence along any highway, which shall be accepted by the Council, as necessary to public travel shall be entitled to a Bonus or payment of fifteen cents per rod from this Municipality: and all previous motions in regard to ~~snow~~^{wire}-fences be and are hereby rescinded

A Bylaw to assess for County purposes, for General Township purposes, and for the General and Trustee school Rates as required by Trustees.

Whereas the consolidated Municipal Act gives power to municipal councils to levy and collect rates for all purposes above-mentioned.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows.

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the Assessment Roll for 1904, the sum of Three Thousand One hundred and fifty Dollars and Nineteen cents, \$3150¹⁹, being a rate of 4 mills on the \$.

That is to say, for General Township purposes the sum of Seven hundred and eighty-seven dollars and fifty-five cents \$787⁵⁵, being a rate of 1 mill on the \$.

For General school purposes, the sum of Eleven hundred and eighty-one Dollars and Thirty Two cents \$1181³², being a rate of 1/2 mills on the \$.

For County purposes, the sum of Eleven hundred and eighty-one Dollars and Thirty Two cents being a rate of 1/2 mills on the \$ \$1181³².

And for the several school sections to be levied on the property in said sections as near as may be the following amounts.

Bylaw No 532

A Bylaw to empower the Trustees of school Section No 1 of the Township of North Wellington to raise by way of loan, the sum of two thousand five hundred Dollars, for payment of new school houses.

Whereas the Trustees of school section No 1, of the Township of North Wellington, have made application to the Council as required by Sec 74 of the Public School Act, 1901, to raise by Debentures, the sum of Two thousand Five hundred Dollars, the proposal for such loan having been submitted and sanctioned, at a special meeting of the ratepayers of said section called for the purpose,

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Wellington enact as follows; That there be levied and collected the Trustees of the above mentioned section are hereby empowered to borrow on the credit of said section the sum of Two thousand five hundred Dollars \$2500⁰⁰, to be paid in five annual instalments of five hundred Dollars each, together with interest thereon at the rate of 4½ per cent per annum. The first payment to be made payable December 14th 1905, said amounts to be levied and collected on the property in said section, in the years 1905, 1906, 1907, 1908, 1909, in addition to all other taxes that may be required and that Debentures be issued for the same.
