Bylaw No 537

a Bylaw to assess for bounty purposes, for General Township purposes, and for the General and Trustee school rates as required by Trustees.

Whereas the consolidated Municipal act gives power to municipal councils, to levy and collect rates for all purposes above-mentioned,

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury acts as follows.

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property on the Assessment Roll for 1905, the sum of \$3714.<sup>78</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Three thousand seven hundred and fourteen dollars and seventy-eight cents, being a rate of 4 mills on the \$.

That is to say For General Township purposes, the sum of \$928.<sup>76</sup>/<sub>100</sub> nine hundred and twenty-eight dollars and seventy cents, being a rate of 1 mill on the \$,

For General school purposes, the sum of \$1160.<sup>86</sup>/<sub>100</sub> eleven hundred and sixty dollars and eighty-six cents, being a rate of 1 1/4 mills on the \$,

For bounty purposes, the sum of \$1625.<sup>22</sup>/<sub>100</sub> sixteen hundred and twenty-five dollars and twenty-two cents, being a rate of 1 3/4 mill on the \$,

And for the several school sections to be levied on the property in said sections, as near as may be the following
