A. Bylaw to appoint certain Township Officers for the Township of North Guilimbury for the year 1913.

Be it enacted by The Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury

1st That John Hamilton Jr. and John Harritt Jr. be and ^{are} hereby appointed Auditors to audit the accounts of the Township of North Guilimbury for the year 1912. and that they receive the sum of Three Dollars each for their services as such.

2nd That Robert A. Hamilton be and is hereby appointed assessor for the Township of North Guilimbury for the year 1913 at a salary of Seventy Dollars.

3rd That D. E. Sprague be and is hereby appointed Collector for the Township of North Guilimbury for the year 1913 at a salary of Sixty Dollars.

Bylaw. No. 602

A Bylaw to Authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North & Willimbury to borrow certain sums to meet the now current expenditure.

Whereas the Taxes levied for the current expenditure of the said Corporation for the year have not yet been fully collected there being uncollected of such Taxes a sum not less than the sum hereby authorized to be borrowed.

And whereas the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars will be required to meet the now current expenses of the said Corporation during the current year before the Taxes levied therefor are collected and it is expedient subject to the conditions hereinafter contained to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North & Willimbury as follows:-

1st That the Head with the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized under the seal of the Corporation but only in the manner and subject to the conditions below mentioned, to borrow from The Metropolitan Bank the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars.

required to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation provided always that the amount so borrowed and outstanding shall not at any time exceed the amount which may be legally borrowed under the Consolidated Municipal Act to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation

2nd That the Head with the Treasurer aforesaid be and they are hereby authorized to pay or allow the said Bank interest on the said sum so borrowed at the rate of Six per cent per annum.

3rd That promissory note repayable on or before the last business day of the current year sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the corporation by the Head and Treasurer be duly executed and given to the said Bank as aforesaid as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.

A. By Law to assess for County purposes for General Township purposes and for the several school sections as the Law directs.

Whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the Consolidated Municipal Act to Levy and Collect rates for all purposes above mentioned,

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Willimby enacts as follows.

That there be Levied and Collected from all the Rateable property on the Assessment Roll for the year 1913 the sum of Eight Thousand one Hundred and Four Dollars and Eighteen Cents $\$8104\frac{18}{100}$ Being at the Rate of 7 Mills on the \$,

That is to say for general Township purposes the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred and Thirty Three Dollars and Eighteen Cents being at a rate of 2 $\frac{3}{10}$ Mills on the \$

For general school purposes the sum of Two Thousand one Hundred and Seventy Five $\$2175\frac{00}{100}$ Being at a rate of 1 $\frac{1}{10}$ Mills on the \$

For County purposes the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred and Ninety Five and Seventy Eight Cents $(\$2595\frac{78}{100})$ being at a rate of 2 $\frac{3}{10}$ Mills on the \$

By-Law No. 607

A By-Law to provide to borrow money by the issue and sale of debentures for the purpose of constructing a bridge on the highway of lot 13 concession 7 in the Municipality of the Township of North & Willimbury.

Whereas the bridge on the highway within the Municipality of North & Willimbury has been swept away by recent floods and completely destroyed,

And whereas it is deemed advisable to replace said bridge by a good and permanent structure and for that purpose it will be necessary to raise the sum of \$4500.⁰⁰ and whereas the total amount required to be raised annually for the payment of said debts and interest over and above all other rates and assessments amount to \$82.75 and whereas the amount of the whole rateable property of the corporation of the Township of North & Willimbury according to the last revised assessment Roll amounts to the sum of \$1154800.⁰⁰,

And whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said corporation is \$2400.⁰⁰ School debentures S. S. No. 3.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Township of North & Willimbury in the County of York enacts as follows, That it shall be lawful for the Reeve and ~~Treasurer~~ of the said Municipality and he is hereby authorized for the purpose aforesaid to borrow the sum of \$4500.⁰⁰ and to issue debentures under the seal of said Corporation to the amount of \$4500.⁰⁰ in sums of not ^{over}

than \$100.⁰⁰ each payable within a period of Ten years with interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum in equal annually installments with principal and interest as set forth in the schedule hereto, ~~annexed~~

That the said debentures shall be sealed with seal of the Corporation and shall be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer and known and marked bridge debentures,

That the said debenture shall be payable at the Metropolitan Bank Sutton West on the Days and Time herein set out,

That for the payment of said debentures from year to year as they mature, there shall be levied and collected, be raised and levied in each and every year for during the said period of Ten years on all the rateable property of the said Municipality in addition to all other rates the sum of \$582.75 dollars. Being a sum sufficient to pay the several installments of principal and interest accruing due on the said debent as provided in the following schedule
