By-Law No. 623,

A By-Law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillembury to borrow certain sums to meet the now current expenditure.

Whereas the Taxes levied for the current expenditure of the said corporation for the year have not yet been fully collected there being uncollected of such Taxes a sum not less than the sum hereby authorized to be borrowed.

And whereas the sum of Twenty five hundred Dollars will be required to meet the current expenses of the Corporation during the current year before the Taxes levied therefor are collected, and it is expedient subject to the conditions hereinafter contained to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillembury as follows:—

1st That the Head with the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized under the Seal of the Corporation but only in the manner and subject to the conditions below mentioned to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars required to meet the now current expenditure of the said corporation, provided always that the sum so borrowed and outstanding shall not at any time exceed the amount which may be legally borrowed under the consolidated Municipal Act to meet the now current expenditure of the said corporation.

By-Law No. 626.

A By-Law to restrain and regulate the running at large of Dogs in the Township of North Guillemburg

As provided by section 420 Chap. 192 of R. S. O. 1914, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg enacts as follows.

- 1st That all Dogs within said Township must either be securely chained in an out house or other building, or kept under lock and key or kept securely muzzled with effective metallic muzzles and that all dogs are not allowed to run on any highway whether muzzled or not.
- 2nd, Any Dogs found running at large may be destroyed, and the owner or harborer of said dog shall be liable to a fine, under summary conviction of not less than \$5.00 or not more than \$200.00
- 3rd Any dogs found running at large contrary to the last clause of section one of this By-Law, the owner or harborer of said dog shall be liable to a fine under summary of not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$100.00
- 4th That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and are hereby repealed.
- 5th That this By-Law take effect and be in force April 1st 1915!

By Law No. 629.

A By-Law to assess for Township purposes County purposes and the General School section as the Law directs;

Whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the Consolidated Municipal Act to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned also under Chap. 3, Sec. 486, of George V. 1915 to levy and collect rates for the Provincial War Tax,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilfimbury as follows.

I That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for the year 1915 the sum of Eight Thousand and Eighty Seven Dollars and Seventy Five Cents, (\$8087.⁷⁵) being at the rate of 6 $\frac{1}{10}$ Mills on the Dollar.

2 That is to say for general Township purposes the sum of Three Thousand One Hundred and Twenty Nine Dollars and Forty Five Cents, being at the rate of 2 $\frac{5}{10}$ Mills on the Dollar.

3 For general School purposes the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred and Seventy Five Dollars being at the rate of 1 $\frac{7}{10}$ Mills on the Dollar.

4 For County purposes the sum of Two Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Two Dollars and Sixty Cents being at the rate of 2 $\frac{3}{10}$ Mills on the Dollar.

5 For provincial War Tax the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred and Ninety Six Dollars and Seventy Three Cents, being at the rate of 1 Mill on the Dollar.

By Law No. 630

A. By Law to provide to borrow money by the Issue and sale of Debentures for the purpose of constructing a Bridge on the Highway of Lot 9, Concession Three in the Municipality of the Township of North Gwillimbury better known as the Jersey Bridge

Whereas the Bridge within the said Municipality being unsafe for public Travel and whereas the Council deem it advisable to replace the same by a concrete structure and for that purpose it will be necessary to raise the sum of \$3500.⁰⁰ and whereas the Total amount required to be raised annually for the payment of said debts and interest over and above all other rates and assessments amounts to the sum of \$689.⁶⁰ and whereas the Amount of the whole rateable property of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury according to the last revised assessment Roll amounts to the sum of \$1251780.⁰⁰,

And whereas the Amount of the Existing Debenture debt of the said Corporation is \$5849.⁷⁵, being School Debentures No. 3. and Thompson Bridge Debentures,

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows,

That it shall be lawful for the Reeve of the said Municipality and he is hereby authorized for the purpose aforesaid to borrow the sum of \$3500.⁰⁰ and to Issue debentures under the Seal of the Corporation to the amount of \$3500.⁰⁰ in sums of not less than \$100.⁰⁰ each payable within a period of six years with interest at the rate of 5% per annum.

That the said Debentures shall be sealed
with the Seal of the Corporation and shall
be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer and
known and marked Bridge Debentures,

That the said Debentures shall be
payable at the Bank of Nova Scotia, Sutton
West on the days and times set forth in
the following schedule,

That for the ^{payment} of said Debentures from year
to year as they mature there shall be levied
and collected be raised and levied in each
and every year during the said period of
six years on the rateable property of the
said Municipality, in addition to all other
rates the sum of \$689.⁶⁰ being a sum
sufficient to pay the several installements
of principal and interest accruing due on
said debt as provided in the following schedule
