## By-Law No. 642.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to regulate the running at large of and trespassing of Animals other than dogs and varying the application of the Pounds Act in the Municipality

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of North & Willimbury as follows.

I Save and except as is hereinafter provided to the contrary, animals, other than dogs are hereby permitted and allowed to run at large subject to such regulations as the Council may from time to time adopt and determine.

2 No Bull over the age of Ten months shall be allowed to run at large.

3 The owner of any Bull or Ram running at large contrary to the provisions of the next preceding section shall be liable in damages for all injuries committed by such animal and also to a penalty not exceeding \$10.00 recoverable under the provisions of the Ontario Summary Convictions Act.

4 Damages however may be recoverable from the owner or the acceptant of any land in this Municipality having under his charge or keeping any animal other than dogs in respect of injuries committed upon any land where any such animal has broken through or over a fence then being in reasonably good repair and of the height of four and one half feet.

5 Whenever any animal other than dogs has broken through or jumped over a fence then being in reasonably good repair and of the height of four and a half feet or whenever such animal other than dogs is running at large contrary to the Municipal regulations then the same may be

distrained for trespassing by a resident  
of this Municipality,

6 Sections 7 to 25 inclusive of the Pounds  
act shall apply in this Municipality  
except and in so far only as the same  
may be inconsistent with this By-Law.

7 The expenses of the impounded animals  
keeping with the fees and charges of the  
pound keepers which may be from time to  
time be fixed and adopted shall be due and  
payable to the Pound Keeper as his own  
property.

## By Law No. 644,

A. By Law to alter certain Road - Divisions in the Township of North Guilimbury

Whereas it is deemed expedient - owing to the County assuming certain roads of the Township of North Guilimbury as a county road system, to change certain Road Divisions now assumed by the County.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of Township of North Guilimbury as follows.

That R. Div. No. 1. extend easterly from the Lake shore along the side - roads including a portion of the 4<sup>th</sup> Con. between lots 5 & 6. Con 2-3 & 4 and extending to the centre of lot 6, Con. 4

Div. No. 2, commencing at the Lake Shore between lots 10 & 11. Con. 2. and extending easterly to the centre of the Concession of the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>

Div No. 10. That the Statute Labor commencing at lot 14. Con. 9. and extending westerly to include the Statute Labor of Lot 10, Con 9 also including the Labor on the sixth Con. from the Lake shore to southerly limit of lot 22. Con 5 & 6. the Statute labor to be performed on the 6<sup>th</sup> Con.

R. Div to be known as No. 47. That the Statute labor commencing at lot 15. Con. 9 and including all that portion of Statute labor extending easterly to the Town line, the work to be performed on the 7<sup>th</sup> Con. from the Base line to the Catering road.

R. Div. No. 15 be cancelled and added to Div. 39 also that portion of Statute Labor included in lot 18 & 19. Con. 4. be added to Div. 29.

R. Div No. 19. be extended to the South Town line and include the Statute Labor of lots 1 and 2. Con 4.

By Law No. 644 could

R. Div. No. 20. shall consist of the side-road between lots 20, 21, Con. 4, and shall include the statute labor of the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  lot 21 con 4, W  $\frac{1}{2}$  lot 21 & 22 Con 5; the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  lot 22, con 4 W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  lot 23 con 5; and the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  lot 21 con 4 E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  lot 20 con 4 E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  lots 19 & 20, Con 4,

R. Div. No. 38. shall include all the statute labor on the Base line commencing at Lot 14 Con. 9, and easterly to the 4<sup>th</sup> <sup>con.</sup> and include the R. Div known as No. 25, labor to be performed on the Base line between the 4 & 5<sup>th</sup> Con's and northerly on the 5 con. to the lake shore

R. Div. No. 5, be changed and the portion between the 4 & 5 Con's, be cancelled,

R. Div No. 39. Commence at Lot 16 Con 4 and extend northerly to the side-road between lots 20 & 21 Con. 4, and include the statute labor of Div No. 15 also a portion of the statute labor of pt lots 18 & 19, Con. 4 also of <sup>W.  $\frac{1}{2}$</sup>  lots 15 & 16 Con 4 and <sup>W.  $\frac{1}{2}$</sup>  lots 16 & 17 Con 4.

R. Div. No 26. be amended by adding the statute labor of E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of lots 15-16-17, Con 4 and including the farm now occupied by H. King,

R. Div No. 22. be amended by adding the statute labor of H. A. W inch,

R. Div. No. 50 commencing at the S. Town line con. 5; extending northerly to north boundary of Lot 5, Con 5; and including the statute labor of the farm now occupied by Thos. Shanks,

R. Div No. 54. Commencing at the south line fence of the lot occupied at the parsonage Lot 16, Con 4 and extending northerly <sup>along the 5<sup>th</sup> con.</sup> to the north line of the lot occupied by Perry Morton,

By Law No 641

A. By Law to Authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Township of North Sullimbury to borrow certain sums of to meet the now current expenditures.

Whereas the Taxes levied for the current expenditure of the said Corporation for the year have not yet been fully collected there being uncollected of such Taxes as sum not less than the sum hereby authorized to be borrowed.

And whereas the sum of Three Thousand Dollars will be required the current expenses of the said Corporation during the current year before the Taxes levied therefor are collected, and it is expedient subject to the conditions hereinafter contained to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Sullimbury as follows.

I

That the Head with the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized, under the seal of the Corporation but only in the manner and subject to the conditions below mentioned to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, required to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation, Provided always that the amount so borrowed and outstanding shall not at any time exceed Eighty per cent of the amount collected as taxes to pay the ordinary current expenditure of the said Corporation in the municipal year preceding the passing hereof.

By. Law 641. Contd.

2 That the Head with the Treasurer aforesaid he and they are hereby authorized to pay or allow the said Bank interest on the said sum so borrowed at the rate of six per cent per Annum.

3 That a promissory note or notes covenant or agreement sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Reeve and Treasurer and containing such terms not inconsistent with this By. Law as they may think proper, be duly executed and given to the said Bank as aforesaid as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.

By Law No. 647.

A. By Law to provide for cost of construction of a roadway from Lake Shore Road to Metropolitan Railway, allowance on lot No. 41 in concessions two and three of the Township of North Guilimbury,

Whereas a three fourths majority of the owners named in the Schedule of assessment hereto annexed representing at least two thirds of the value of the lands included in such schedule, have petitioned the Council of this Corporation to levy and collect the cost of the construction of a certain roadway extending from the Lake Shore Road to the Road allowance of the Metropolitan Railway on lot No. 41 in concessions numbers two and three of the Township of North Guilimbury and to assess the cost of the same, not exceeding the sum of Four Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars (\$425<sup>00</sup>) against the owners named in the said schedule under the Municipal Act and the local improvement Act and to pay the monies levied therefor to the Treasurer of the Island Grove Association the names of whose members appear on said schedule and it is expedient to grant such petition,

By Law, 647. Contd.,

Now the Municipal Council of the Township of North Willimbury hereby enacts,

That the Clerk of the said Township shall and he is hereby empowered to levy under the provisions of the Municipal Act, and the local improvement Act, in that behalf, contained against the lands mentioned in the said schedule, the sum of Four Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars (\$425.00) One Hundred and fifty Dollars, (\$150.00) to be levied and collected within the first year after the passing of this By-Law, and the balance at six per cent per annum thereon in equal portions in the two following years.

That the said special levy shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as other Taxes, and the monies realized therefrom shall forthwith be paid by the Township Treasurer over to the Treasurer of the Island Grove Association to cover the cost of the construction of the said roadway the exact location whereof is to be left to the decision of the members of the said Association,

By-Law No. 648.

A By-Law to assess for Township purposes, County purposes, and the General school sections as the law directs whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the Consolidated Municipal Act to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned, also under Chap. 3. Sec. 4 & 5 of George 5. 1915 to levy and collect rates for the provincial war Tax,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilford as follows.

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for the year 1917 the sum of sixteen thousand, seven hundred and thirty six dollars, and sixty eight cents, ( $\$16,736.68$ ) being at the rate of  $13\frac{6}{10}$  mills on the Dollar.

That is to say for General Township purposes the sum of three thousand one hundred and sixty three dollars and sixty eight cents, being at the rate of  $2\frac{5}{10}$  mills on the Dollar.

For General School purposes the sum of two thousand one hundred and seventy five dollars being at the rate of  $1\frac{9}{10}$  mills on the Dollar.

For County purposes the sum of eight thousand three hundred and forty two dollars, and twenty eight cents being at the rate of  $6\frac{9}{10}$  mills on the Dollar.

By Law 648. could,

For provincial War Tax the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred and Eighty One Dollars and Twenty Four cents, being at the rate of One Mill on the Dollar.

For to pay the Debentures of the Thompson and Jersey Bridges the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred and Seventy Two Dollars and Thirty five cents, being at the rate of 1 mill on the Dollar.
