A. By-Law to appoint certain Township for the Township of North Guilimbury for the year 1918.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Guilimbury

1st

That Perry Morton, and John Hamilton Jr. be and they are hereby appointed Auditors to audit the Township accounts for the year 1918 and that they receive the sum of Five Dollars, each, for their services as such,

2nd

That D. E. Sprague be and is hereby appointed assessor for the year 1918, and that he receive the sum of \$95.00, in addition to the fees provided by statute, for his services as such,

3rd

That John Marritt Jr. be and is hereby collector for the year 1918 and that he receive the sum of \$85.00 for his services as such,

4th

That Jesse Bonnell be and is hereby appointed a member of the local board of Health for a period of one year,

By Law, No. 653.

A. By Law to Authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Township of North Guillemburg to borrow certain sums of money to meet the now current expenditures.

Whereas the Taxes levied for the current expenditure of the said Corporation for the year have not yet been fully collected there being uncollected of such Taxes a sum not less than than the sum hereby authorized to be borrowed,

And whereas the sum of Three Thousand Dollars will be required, the current expenses of The said Corporation during the current year, before the Taxes levied therefor are fully collected, and it is expedient subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum,

Be it therefore enacted by The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg as follows,

(1) That the Head with The Treasurer of The said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized under the Seal of The Corporation, but only in the manner and subject to the conditions below mentioned, to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, required to meet the now current expenditure of The said Corporation, provided always that the amount so borrowed and outstanding shall not at any time exceed eighty per cent of the amount collected as Taxes, to pay the ordinary current expenditure of The said Corporation in the municipal year preceding the passing hereof.

(2) That the Head with The Treasurer aforesaid be and they are hereby authorized to pay or allow the said Bank interest on The said sum so borrowed at The rate of six per cent interest per annum,

(3) That a promissory note or notes, covenant or agreement, sealed with The Corporate Seal, and signed on behalf of The Corporation

by the Reeve and Treasurers and containing such terms not inconsistent with this By-Law, as they may think proper, be duly executed and given to the said Bank as aforesaid as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid,

By Law No. 655

Authorizing the planting, trimming and cutting down etc, of trees in the Highways

Whereas it is deemed expedient for the purpose of public improvement and safety of travel to authorize and empower a committee of the Council to plant, trim and cut down etc, trees in the Highways

And whereas under the provisions of section 487 of the Municipal Act, the Council has the right to pass such a By Law,

Therefore be it enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Willimbury

(1) That the Reeve and Road Commissioners holding office and appointment from time to time shall be and they are hereby declared and appointed to be a committee for the purposes following

(a) Plant or cause to be planted trees in the Highways of this Municipality,

(B) Trim or cause to be trimmed all trees on private property the branches of which extend over the Highway,

(c) Cut down or remove or caused to be cut down or removed all decayed trees,

(d) Remove or transplant or cause to be removed or transplanted any tree planted or growing in any Highway, square, lane or other public communication after 48 hours notice in writing to the occupant of the land opposite to which the tree is planted or growing, but no live tree, unless within 30 feet of another tree shall be removed without the consent of the owner,

(2) The notice mentioned in clause (d) may be given by leaving it with a grown up person resident upon the land, or if the land is unoccupied by posting it in a conspicuous place on the land,

3. The express permission of the Council is hereby given the aforesaid committee to exercise the powers conferred on them as and when this Council or the said Committee deem necessary for the purpose of public improvement or safety of travel upon the Highways of this Municipality

By Law No. 656

A By Law to assess for Township purposes County purposes, patriotic purposes, and the several school sections as the Law directs,

whereas power is given municipal councils by the Consolidated Municipal Act to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned also under Chap. 3, Sec 475 of George V. 1915 to levy and collect rates for the provincial War Tax,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilfimbury as follows.

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for the year 1918, the sum of Twenty one Thousand Five Hundred and ninety five and ninety one cents, (\$21595.⁹¹/₁₀₀)

\$3177.⁰⁰/₁₀₀

That is to say for general Township purposes the sum of Three Thousand one hundred and seventy seven Dollars being at the rate of 2⁵/₁₀ Mills on the Dollar,

For general school purposes the sum of Two Thousand one hundred and seventy five dollars (\$2175.⁰⁰/₁₀₀) being at the rate of 1⁰/₁₀ Mills, on the dollar,

For county purposes the sum of Thirteen Thousand five hundred and seventy seven dollars and eighty four cents, (\$13577.⁸⁴/₁₀₀) being at the rate of 11 Mills on the Dollar,

For provincial war tax the sum of one thousand three hundred and ninety three dollars and seventy two cents, (\$1393.⁷²/₁₀₀) being at the rate of 1 mill on the dollar,

For to pay the debentures of the Thompson and Jersey Bridges the sum of one thousand two hundred and seventy two cents (\$1272.³⁵/₁₀₀) being at the rate of 1 mill on the dollar,

For the special levy for building the road at Island Grove the sum of one hundred and fifty four dollars, (\$154.⁰⁰/₁₀₀) being at the rate of 7 Mills on the Dollar.

from Horses and Pigs running at large
and in breaking through or over a fence
not being of the height of four and a half feet.

That the first and second parts of sub-
section five after the word (Dogs) shall
include Horses and Pigs,

By Law No, 658,

A By. Law to make provision for damages sustained by sheep being killed or injured by a dog or dogs and appointing valuator,

Whereas under and subject to the provisions of paragraph 9th of section 400, of the Municipal Act; and of sub section 3, of this Sec, (The Dog Law and sheep protection Act;) power is given Municipal Councils to levy and collect rates on dogs in every local municipality,

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilfimbury,

That there be levied and collected an annual Tax upon the owner or harbored of a dog or dogs in this Municipality of at least \$2.00 for a dog if only one, and \$4.00 for each additional dog owned or harbored by him, and \$4.00 for a Bitch if only one and \$6.00 for each additional Bitch owned or harbored by him,

That the following named persons and their successors in Office, be and they are hereby appointed Valuator for the purpose of valuating all sheep killed or injured by a dog or dogs when the owners intend applying to the Council for compensation under the provisions of the Act; cited (The Dog Tax and sheep protection Act)

- Namely, William Mahoney for Div. No. 1
- James Nelson " " " 2
- Donald Davidson " " " 3,

And it shall be the duty of the above named Valuator upon being notified by the owner of the sheep killed or injured, or the clerk of the Municipality to proceed to the place where the sheep, have been killed or injured within forty eight hours after the discovery of the damage, and make a report in detail to the extent of the injury and the amount of the damage done, to the clerk of the Municipality and shall at the same time forward a copy to the owner of the sheep damaged,

(over)

And that the above named Valuers shall receive for their services the sum of at the rate of Three dollars per day, as such the said payment to be made by the Treasurer on order of the Council signed by the Reeve,

And that the person or persons suffering damages as aforesaid, shall be entitled to full damages, upon application to the Municipal Council and the certified report of one or more Valuers and where the owner of the dog or dogs committing the said damage can not be found,

and it is further enacted that any claim for damages suffered, not complying with the above named conditions, that the same may be refused consideration and remuneration by the Council for non-compliance with the same

And that all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and they are hereby repealed,

That this By-Law shall be in full force and virtue and shall include sections of the Act, cited the Dog Law and Sheep protection Act, not included in this By-Law, passed in open Council this the second day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighteen,
