By-Law No. 663.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow the sum of Three Thousand Dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year until the Taxes are paid.

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under section 319 of Chapter 192 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario.

Be it therefore enacted as a By-Law by the said Council as follows.

1. That the Head and the Treasurer, of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation, or by way of Over draft, or otherwise, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000⁰⁰/₁₀₀) until such time as the Taxes levied, or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank.
3. That the Head with the Treasurer, may draw make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sums or sums borrowed from time to time borrowed under this By-Law.
4. That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal, and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current ~~day~~ year together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer deem necessary.

By Law No. 664.

Or. By Law to assess for Township purposes County purposes, and the several school sections as the Law directs,

Whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the consolidated Municipal Act, to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Guillemburg as follows,

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for the year 1919. The sum of Nineteen Thousand Three Hundred and Twenty Two Dollars and Eight Cents being at the rate of $15\frac{1}{10}$ mills on the dollar.

That is to say for General Township purposes the sum of Three Thousand one hundred and Ninety Eight dollars and Thirty seven Cents being at the rate of $2\frac{5}{10}$ mills on the dollar,

For general school purposes the sum of Two Thousand one hundred and seventy Five dollars being at the rate of $1\frac{7}{10}$ mills on the dollar,

For County purposes the sum of Twelve Thousand Five hundred and Forty Eight dollars and Fifty Three cents being at the rate of $9\frac{8}{10}$ mills on the dollar,

For to pay the debentures on the Thompson and Jersey bridges the sum of one Thousand Two hundred and seventy Two Dollars and Fifty Three cents being at the rate 1 mill on the dollar

That the special levy for building the road at Island Grove the sum of one hundred and Fifty Three dollars being at the rate of six mills on the dollar,

For the special levy for ciding the roads from Herwick to the Fourth Con, at the lake shore, the sum of six hundred and seventy Five dollars being at the rate of $2\frac{5}{10}$ mills on the dollar,

For the several school sections as near as may be the following amounts,
