A By-Law to appoint certain Township Officers for the year 1921

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury as follows,

I. That John Hamilton Jr. and Perry Morton be and are hereby appointed Auditors to audit the Township accounts for the year 1920 and that they receive the sum of Five dollars each for their services as such,

2 That Howard Willoughby be and is hereby appointed assessor for the year 1921, and that he receive the sum of One Hundred dollars for his services as such, in addition to the fees provided by statute,

3 That Herbert Winch be and is hereby appointed collector for the year 1921 and that he receive the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars for his services as such,

4 That Jesse Cornell be and is hereby appointed a member of the local Board of Health for a period of one year,

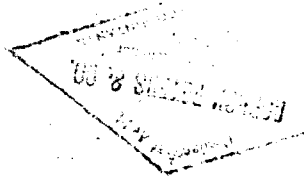
5 That Peter McClellan be and is hereby appointed Truant officer for the year 1921 and that he receive the sum of Thirty Five dollars for his services as such,

## By-Law No. 679

To regulate the running at large of Dogs,  
Whereas under the provisions of the Municipal Act, the Councils of Cities, Towns Villages and Townships are authorized to pass By-Laws for regulating the running at large of dogs,

And whereas by the dog tax and sheep protection Act of 1920 it is provided that after the first day of April 1921, in Towns, Villages and Townships every owner of a dog shall procure from the Corporation a tag for each dog owned by him and shall keep each tag securely affixed to the dog at all times

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillembury as follows,

- I That the Assessor for the said Township be and is hereby required to comply with the provisions of the dog tax and sheep protection Act in reference to the assessment of dogs, and to deliver to every person assessed a numbered tag for each dog, bitch or spayed bitch owned by him,
- 2 That the numbers of the tags so delivered shall be entered on the statements delivered to the assessor of the number of the dogs owned by the persons assessed, said statements to be returned to the Clerk, with the assessment Roll,
- 3 That it shall be the duty of the Clerk to procure and deliver to the assessor suitable dog tags as required by him and to keep a record showing the serial number of the tag and the name of the owner to whom it has been issued
- 4 That the owner of the dog receiving a tag from the assessor shall keep such tag securely fixed on the dog at all times
- 5 That after the assessor has returned his roll it shall be the duty to supply tags to the owners of dogs and to charge a fee of twenty five cents for each tag.

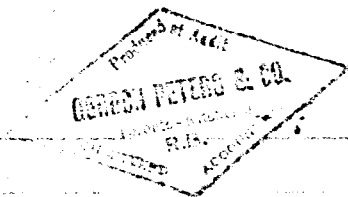

By Law No. 685,

A. By Law to provide to borrow by the issue and sale of Debentures, for the purpose of constructing a bridge on the highway on Road, No. 4. of lot No. 9, in the Municipality of the Township of North Guillemburg, better known as the Areekon Bridge,

whereas the Bridge is unsafe for public travel and whereas the Council deem it advisable to replace the same by a concrete structure and for that purpose it will be necessary to raise the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars, (\$8000.00)

And whereas the total amount required to raise annually for the repayment of the said debt and interest over and above all other rates and assessments amounts to the sum of (\$1288.30) One Thousand Two, hundred and Eighty Eight Dollars and Thirty cents,

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg according to the last revised assessment Roll amounts to the sum of, \$1518200.00

And whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Corporation is \$14848.25 being debentures on the Thompson Bridge,

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg enacts as follows,

That it shall be lawful for the Reeve and of the said Municipality and he is hereby authorized for the purpose aforesaid to borrow the sum of \$8000.00, and to issue debentures under the seal of the Corporation to the amount of \$8000.00 in sums of not less than \$100.00 each, payable within a period of Eight years, with interest at the rate of Six per cent, per annum in equal installments with principal and interest as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed,

That the said debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the Corporation, and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer and known and marked bridge debentures,

That the said debentures shall be payable at the Bank of Nova Scotia Sutton West or the Sterling Bank at Keswick on the days and times set forth in the following schedule,

By Law. 685.  
 That for the repayment of the said debentures from year to year as they mature, there shall be levied and collected, be raised and levied in each and every year during the said period of eight years, on all the rateable property of the said municipality in addition to all other rates the sum of \$1288.<sup>30</sup> principal and interest accruing, being a sum sufficient to pay the several installments of principal and interest accruing due on the said debt as provided in the following schedule,

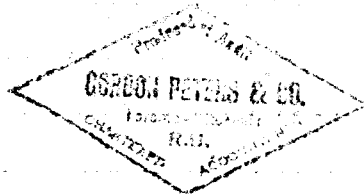

By Law No. 683,

To authorize the borrowing of money to meet current ordinary expenditure for the year,

whereas it is deemed necessary the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow the sum of Five Thousand Dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year until the Taxes are paid,

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Sec. 319. of Chapter 192, of the Revised Statutes of Ontario

Be it therefore enacted as a By-Law, by the said Council as follows,

I That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation or by way of overdraft, or otherwise, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5000.00) until such time as the Taxes levied, or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance,

2 That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed upon between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank,

3 That the Head and the Treasurer may draw make and deliver promissory notes bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law,

4. That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day, by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the said sum, by the said Corporation and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer may deem necessary

By-Law No. 684,

To authorize the borrowing of money to meet current ordinary expenditure for the year,

Whereas it is deemed necessary that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury to borrow the sum of Five Thousand Dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year until the Taxes are paid,

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid, and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Sec. 319. of Chapter 192 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario,

Be it therefore enacted as a By-Law by the said Council as follows,

I That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Sterling Bank at Keswick, on the note of the Corporation, or by way of over-draft, or otherwise the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, \$5000.<sup>00</sup>, until such time as the Taxes levied, or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance,

2 That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient, and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head the Treasurer and the Bank,

3 That the Head and the Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sum sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law.

4 That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the Corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year together with all other terms relating to such borrowing, and repayment as the Head and Treasurer may deem necessary.

By Law No. 686,

A. By Law to assess, for Township purposes County purposes, and the several school purposes as the Law directs,

Whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the Consolidated Municipal Act, to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilford as follows,

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property in the assessment Roll for the year 1921. the sum of Nineteen thousand seven hundred and twenty eight dollars and eighty cents, being at the rate of 13 mills on the Dollar,

That is to say for general Township purposes the sum of three thousand seven hundred and ninety four dollars, being at the rate of 2 1/2 mills on the dollar,

For general school purposes the sum of five thousand three hundred and eleven dollars and sixty cents, being at the rate of 3 1/2 mills on the \$

For County purposes the sum of ten thousand six hundred and twenty three dollars and twenty cents, being at the rate of 7 mills on the Dollar,

The Special Tax for ciling the Road from Keswick to the fourth Concession, by the lake shore Road, the sum of seven hundred and ten dollars and eighty cents being at the rate of 2 mills on the \$

The Special Tax of street lighting, payable by the residents of the village of Keswick under a signed petition of three hundred and forty two dollars being in a portion of \$6.50 each.

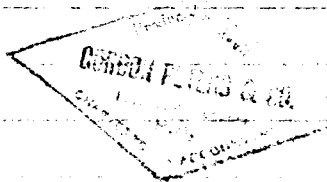

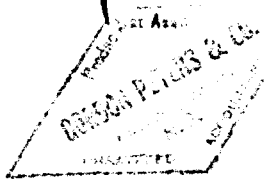
