A. By. Law to appoint a Road Overseer for the Township of North Guilimbury in the County of York.

Whereas it is deemed advisable that the laying out and supervision of all work and expenditure upon improvement and maintenance of roads, within the exclusive jurisdiction of this Township, should be under the supervision of a road overseer, acting under the direction of this Council,

And whereas it is desire of this Council to take advantage of the Ontario Highways Act, 1915 and to receive the Government grant as provided in section (1) of the said Act,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of North Guilimbury and it is hereby enacted,

That William Winch, Behaven, Ont. is appointed Road Overseer in the said Township to act as aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said section (11) of the said Act, from the first day of January 1921, and during the pleasure of the said Council,

That the said William Winch shall be paid at the rate \$ _____ per _____ for such time as he may be employed,

That it shall be the duty of the overseer to lay out and supervise all work and expenditure on Roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of the said Council, and to conform to such general regulations as the department of public Highways may prescribe,

That all By. Laws or parts thereof, and all or any resolutions of said Council contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed,

That a certified copy of this By. Law be forwarded by the Clerk, without delay to the Deputy Minister Department of public Highways, Parliament Buildings, Toronto,

A. By-Law to provide for expenditure on roads in the Township of North Gwillimbury during the year 1921

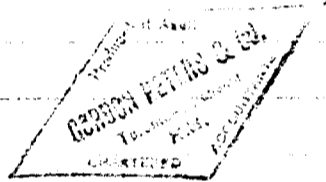

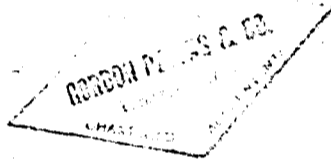

a. By Law to authorize the borrowing of money to meet current expenditure,

whereas the Taxes levied or to be levied for the current expenditure of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury for the year 1922, have not been collected, and there is or will be payable in respect of such Taxes a sum sufficient to authorize the borrowing hereinafter provided for.

And whereas the Council of the said Corporation deem it necessary to borrow the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars, to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation and it is expedient to authorize the borrowing of the said sum, upon the credit of the Corporation and whereas it appears, by the estimates for the current year that there will be required to pay the ordinary current expenditure of the Municipality the sum of \$2500.00 Dollars,

And whereas the ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year immediately preceding was \$34396.³⁶

and whereas the amount now borrowed and all other borrowings made by the Corporation this year do not amount to more than 90 per cent. of the ordinary current expenditure of the Corporation for the year immediately preceding as shown by the amount in the preceding paragraph,

And whereas no sum has been borrowed or is now outstanding in respect of any borrowing to meet current expenditure of the Corporation for the present year except,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury as follows.

I The Head or acting head for the time being with the Treasurer of the said Corporation is hereby authorized to borrow in one or more sums, as the same may be required, from the Sterling Bank of Canada, hereinafter called the Bank an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars being the amount which the said Council deems necessary to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation until such time as the Taxes levied or to be levied thereon can be collected,

2 The Head or acting Head of the said Corporation with the Treasurer aforesaid shall have, authority to pay or allow the said Bank interest on the said sums as borrowed at such rate or rates as may be from time to time agreed upon, which interest may be payable in advance and may be deducted from the amounts so to be borrowed,

3 Any promissory note or notes covenants or agreements which may be required by the said Bank may be sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Reeve and Treasurer thereof and duly executed and delivered to the said Bank which said note or notes, covenants or agreements shall obligate the Corporation to repay the said sums to be borrowed together with interest thereon as aforesaid at such times as may be agreed upon,

4 If the amounts to be paid by virtue of any such note or notes, covenants or agreements, shall not have been fully paid at maturity any further note or notes covenants or agreements, may be executed as aforesaid on behalf of the corporation and delivered to the Bank by way of renewal of the said obligations in whole or in part,

5 The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply so much of the said Taxes so to be collected as may be necessary in payment of the obligations of the Corporation created as aforesaid,

3 That the Head and the Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law,

4 That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, provided for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the present year, together with all other terms and agreement relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer may deem necessary,

A. By Law to assess for Township purposes county purposes, and the several School purposes as the law directs,

Whereas power is given municipal Councils by the consolidated Municipal Act, to levy and collect Rates for all purposes above mentioned,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Ferrisburgh as follows,

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll, for the year 1922, the sum of Twenty Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy Four dollars and Fifty Five cents, (\$20874.55) being at the rate of $13\frac{5}{10}$ Mills on the dollar,

That is to say for general Township purposes the sum of Three Thousand, Nine hundred and seventeen dollars and Twenty Five cents, being at the rate of $2\frac{5}{10}$ mills on the dollar,

For paying the debt on the Brecken the sum of One Thousand Two hundred and eighty eight dollars and thirty cents being at the rate of 1 mill on the dollar,

The special Tax for Aiding the Road from Keswick along the lake shore, the sum of Eight hundred dollars being at the rate of 2 mills on the dollar,

The special Tax for street lighting payable by the residents of the Village of Keswick under a signed petition the sum of Three Hundred and Forty Two dollars, being \$6.50 dollars each,

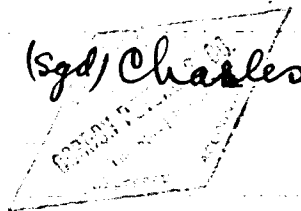
