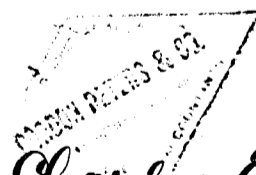
That Jesse Connell be and is hereby appointed sanitary inspection and member of the local Board of Health for a period of one year.

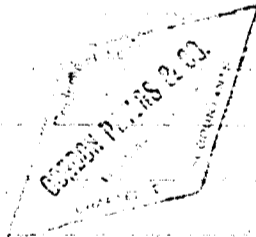

By-Law No. 720,

A. By-Law appointing a Road Overseer for the Township of North Guilimbury in the County of York.

Whereas it is desirable that the laying out and supervision of all work and expenditure upon improvement and maintainance of Roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of this Township, should be under the supervision of a road overseer, acting under the direction of this Council,

And whereas it is the desire of this Council to take advantage of the Ontario Highways Act, 1915 and to receive the Government ~~aid~~ grant as provided in section 11, subsection 1, of the said Act.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury and it is hereby enacted,

I. That Wm. W inch is appointed Road Overseer in the said Township to act as aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said section 11, of the said Act, from the first day of January 1924, and during the pleasure of the said Council,

(2) That the said Wm. W inch shall be paid at the rate of \$3.50 per day for such time as he may be so employed.

(3) That it shall be the duty of the overseer to lay out and supervise all work and expenditure on roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Township Council and to conform to such general regulations as the Department of Public Highways may prescribe.

(4) That all By-Laws or parts thereof and all or any resolutions of said Township contrary thereto or inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

(5) That a certified copy of this By-Law be forwarded by the Clerk without delay to the Deputy Minister, Department of Public Highways, Toronto.

By-Law No. 721.

A. By-Law to provide for expenditure on roads in the Township of North Simcoe during the year 1924. Whereas the regulations of the Department of Public Highways of Ontario require that the expenditure on Township Roads under the Ontario Highways Act, and amendments thereto shall be provided for annually by Township By-Laws.

Therefore the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Simcoe enacts as follows,
 1. The sum of \$5000.00 is hereby appropriated from monies raised by Taxes, for expenditure upon construction on the roads in the said Township during the year 1924.

2. The sum of \$6000.00 is hereby appropriated from monies raised by Taxes, for expenditure upon maintenance and repair on the roads in the Township during the year 1924.

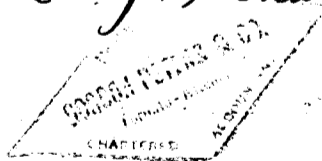
The Money shall be expended under the direction of the duly appointed Road Superintendent,

all work on which the said monies shall be expended shall be performed in accordance with the last revised edition regulations respecting Township Roads issued by the Department of Public Highways of Ontario.

That the Clerk shall transmit two certified copies of this By-Law to the Deputy Minister Department of Public Highways of Ontario within thirty days after the passing thereof.

By Law No. 722.

By Law to Authorize and approve of an agreement between the Hydro Electric power Commission of Ontario and the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury, and to authorize the Clerk of the said Township of North Guilimbury to execute contracts on behalf of the Corporation with individual users of electrical energy in the said Township of North Guilimbury,

Whereas an agreement has been entered into between the Hydro Electric power Commission of Ontario and the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury providing for the supply of electrical energy or power to individual users in the said Township of North Guilimbury a copy whereof is hereto annexed,

Now therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury enacts as follows,

That the Reeve and Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury be and they are hereby authorized and required to execute the agreement between the Hydro Electric power Commission of Ontario and the Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury a copy whereof is hereto attached, and to affix the Corporations seal thereto, and to deliver such agreement when so executed to the Hydro Electric power Commission of Ontario upon receipt of a counterpart thereof duly executed by the Hydro Electric power Commission of Ontario,

That the Clerk of the said Corporation of the Township of North Guilimbury be and is hereby authorized and required to execute all necessary contracts with individual users of electrical power or energy in the said Township of North Guilimbury and to be entered into by the said users and the said Corporation

By Law No. 723.

A. By Law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury to provide for the widening of the Sutton Road allowance, whereas the amount of the whole rateable property of the Township of North Swillimbury according to the last revised and equalized assessment is \$1633100.00

1 And whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Township of North Swillimbury is \$6335.03 whereof no part of the principal or interest is now in arrears,

2 And whereas that portion of the Sutton Road allowance hereinafter more particularly described is of a less width than 66 feet,

3 And whereas it is deemed advisable that the said road allowance be increased to a uniform width of 66 feet,

4 Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury as follows,

5 That the Sutton Road allowance be increased to a uniform width of 66 feet, along that portion of the said road allowance more particularly described as follows,

6 Commencing at a point in the said road allowance 33 feet east of the easterly limit of Con. 3, North Swillimbury and 33 feet west of the westerly limit of concession 2 North Swillimbury which said point is situated on the Easterly production of the line between lots 3 and 4 in the said concession in the said concession 3. Thence Easterly and Northerly along the said road allowance a distance of two and one-eighth miles more or less to a point in the said road allowance being the Northerly limit of lot 14 in the said concession 3.

7 That the Reeve and Clerk of the said Corporation of North Swillimbury be authorized to acquire on behalf of the said Corporation by purchase or expropriation the land within 33 feet on each side of the centre line of the said road allowance not heretofore included in the said road allowance,

That this By Law shall come into force and take effect immediately after the final passing thereof

By Law No. 724.

At. By Law to assess for County purposes, Township purposes, and the several school sections as the Law directs,

Whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the Consolidated Municipal Act to levy and collect rates for all purposes above mentioned,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg as follows;

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for the year 1924, Twenty one Thousand, Seven Hundred and Twenty Dollars, and Twenty Three cents, being at the rate of $13\frac{3}{10}$ mills on the Dollar,

That is to say for County purposes the sum of Eleven Thousand one hundred and Five Dollars and Eight Cents, being at the rate of $6\frac{8}{10}$ mills on the Dollar,

For Township purposes, the sum of Four Thousand and Eighty Two Dollars, and seventy Six cents, being at the rate of $2\frac{5}{10}$ mills on the Dollar,

For general school purposes, the sum Four Thousand, Eight hundred and ninety nine Dollars and Thirty cents, being at the rate of 3 mills on the Dollar,

For paying the debentures on the Breckon bridge the sum of one Thousand six hundred and Thirty Three Dollars, and Ten cents being at the rate of 1 mill on the Dollar,

The special Tax for ceiling the road from Keswick to Jacksons point the sum of One Thousand, Eight Hundred and seventy Dollars and Fifty One cents, being at the rate of $3\frac{3}{10}$ Mills on the Dollar,

The special Tax for street lighting payable by the residents of Keswick the sum of Three Hundred and Forty Two Dollars being in a portion of \$6.50 each,

For the several school sections as near as may be the following amounts,

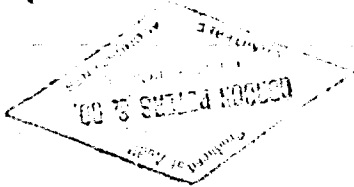

By Law No. 728

Whereas the Taxes levied on to be levied for the current expenditure of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilford for the year 1924, have not been collected and there is or will be payable in respect of such Taxes a sum sufficient to authorize the borrowing hereinafter provided for,

And whereas the Council of the said Corporation deem it necessary to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand dollars, to meet the now current expenditure, of the said Corporation, and it is expedient to authorize the borrowing of the said sum, upon the credit of the Corporation,

And whereas it appears by the estimates for the current year that there will be required to pay the ordinary expenditure of the Municipality the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars,

And whereas the ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year immediately proceeding was \$30,500.00

and whereas the amount now borrowed and all other borrowings made by the Corporation this year do not amount to more than 80 per cent. of the ordinary current expenditure of the Corporation for the year immediately proceeding as shown by the amount in the preceding paragraph,

and whereas no sum has been borrowed or is now outstanding in respect of any borrowing to meet the current expenditure of the Corporation for the present year except \$3,000.00

Be it therefore enacted by the municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilford as follows,

I That the Head or acting head for the time being with the Treasurer of the Corporation is hereby authorized to borrow in one or more sums as the same may be required from the Sterling Bank of Canada hereinafter called the Bank, an amount not exceeding the aggregate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, being the amount which the said Council deem necessary to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation, until such time as the Taxes levied on to be levied thereon can be collected,

2 The Head on acting head of the said Corporation with the Treasurer aforesaid shall have authority to pay or allow the said Bank interest on the said sums as borrowed at such rate or rates as may be from time to time agreed upon which interest may be payable in advance and may be deducted from the amounts to be borrowed,

3 Any promissory note or notes covenants and agreements which may be required by the said Bank may be sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Pres. and Treasurer thereof and duly executed and delivered to the said Bank, which said note or notes covenants and agreements shall obligate the Corporation to repay the said sums to be borrowed, together with interest thereon as aforesaid at such times as may be agreed upon,

4 If the amounts to be paid by virtue of any such note or notes, covenants or agreements, shall not have been fully paid at maturity any further note or notes covenants or agreements may be executed as aforesaid on behalf of the Corporation and delivered to the Bank by way of renewal of the said obligation in whole or in part.

5 The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply of the said Taxes so to be collected as may be necessary in payment of the obligation of the Corporation created as aforesaid,
